1. INTRODUCTION (12-pt)

The section headings are in boldface capital and uppercase letters. It is expected that authors will submit carefully written and proofread material. Spelling and grammatical errors, as well as language usage problems, are not acceptable. There is no strict limitation to the number of pages, but it is suggested that the paper length should not exceed 25 pages.

Papers should clearly describe the background of the subject, the authors work, including the methods used, and concluding discussion on the importance of the work. Papers are to be prepared in English language and SI-units shall be used. Technical terms should be explained unless they may be considered to be known to the broader nuclear community. Acronyms should be written out at their first appearance.

Citations in the text should be denoted with the author's surname and the year of publication, e.g.: (Hamdi et al., 2021) or (Farid, 2022; Mustafa & Nurhanisah, 2019).

If the text contains two or more papers written by the same author(s) in the same year, the citations should be differentiated by a letter; e.g.: (Nasimah, 2018a; Nasimah, 2018b). Journal names should be given in full and should not be translated. Titles of papers should be given in their original language and, if possible, they should be followed by a translation into English in parentheses.

Manuscripts must be typed in Californian FB with single spaced throughout. Uses a 10-point font; employs italics, rather than underlining (except with URL addresses); and all illustrations, figures, and tables are placed within the text at the appropriate points, rather than at the end.

All numbers less than ten should be spelled in full except in the materials and methods section in taxonomic papers. Italicize all scientific names. Use British spellings, metric measurement and 24-hour designation of time (e.g. 2300 hours).

Original articles should be within 4000 to 7000 words in length, including references. We do not accept work published previously or submitted concurrently for publication elsewhere.

2. FORMATTING

Authors can use this template file to construct their papers. Please make the page settings of your word processor to A4 format (21 x 29.7 cm or 8 x 11 inches); with the margins: bottom 2.54 cm and top 2.54 cm, right/left margins must be 3.18 cm.

All text paragraphs should be single spaced. Double spacing should only be used before and after headings and subheadings as shown in this example. Position and style of headings and subheadings should follow this example. Please DO NOT change any of the above-mentioned page, paragraph and font settings.

2.1 Header, Footer, Page Numbering (11-pt)

Second level headings are typed in boldface with capital first letters (like the subsection heading of this paragraph). This template is used when writing the full paper, headers and footers will be set automatically. Authors are only asked to replace the "XXX" number (with the real number assigned once the abstract was accepted) on the header of the first page to set a unique page number.

2.2 Fonts

Papers should use 10-point Californian FB font. The styles available are bold, italic and underlined. It is recommended that text in figures is not smaller than 8-point font size.

2.2.1 Tables and figures (10-pt)

Figure captions and table headings should be sufficient to explain the figure or table without needing to refer to the text. Figures and tables not cited in the text should not be presented. Styles Heading Table and Caption Figure are available in this template for tables and figures. The following is the example for Table 1.


