Enter your "Students" response:

The chosen technology will be built into the LMS, so all students will have easy access to it.

They will be able to access it wherever they have access to the school LMS.

The digital skills needed are very basic.

Enter your "Ease of Use" response

It is very intuitive to use. Students are very familiar with playing videos and using word documents. These are both very easy to maintain and we don't need to worry about the technology provider as the school is very good about making sure the LMS is working.

Enter your "Cost" response

Your Teaching and Pedagogical Considerations response:

Students don't always have a lot of initiative and struggle with being self-starters. I believe this will help guide them.

Your "Interaction" response:

It facilitates interactions in two ways. First of all, they hear and see me explaining. Secondly, they can work on the handout with peers if they wish which will develop relationships and facilitate interactions with other students.

Yes, I think it is a good balance, as it will be a short video with a corresponding worksheet.

Your "Organisational Issues" response:

There are a lot of options that are connected to our LMS and even more that can be integrated into it. I chose fairly simple ones as I felt it didn't need to be complicated to meet the objectives.

I am using standard technologies, as it meets the objective.

Your "Networking" response:

This was an interesting question. I think by providing this not only for the textbook, but also for linked videos and articles, it highlights the importance of other sources of information that students can refer to in the future. I talk about having a folder on their browser as well as a file folder to keep key important documents/links for the future. In that way, this supports connecting beyond the course to other sources that will help students in their profession. I could comment on using LinkedIn as a professional and talk about media sharing in that context.
