## ADJECTIVE FUNCTIONS AND GENERAL DEMANDS – I (EMJS)

Adjectives answer the questions, Which one? What kind? and How many?

There are 4 adjective functions that may be called by Player Three in the Elementary and Middle Divisions:

- NOUN MODIFIER: describes a noun (Examples: The <u>happiest blue</u> birds were <u>prettier</u>.)
- PRONOUN MODIFIER: describes a pronoun (Examples: Someone, <u>sneaky</u> and <u>quiet</u>, became <u>silent</u>.)
- PREDICATE ADJECTIVE: an adjective that follows a linking verb and modifies the subject of the linking verb (Examples: The birds were <u>pretty</u>. They became <u>loudest</u> at dusk.)
- ADJACENT ADJECTIVE: an adjective that immediately precedes or follows the noun or pronoun that it modifies (Examples: The <u>healthier</u> and <u>greener</u> plants lived. <u>Sixty black</u> horses were sleepy.)

In all Divisions, there are 3 adjective general demands that may be called:

- 1. POSITIVE DEGREE OF COMPARISON: The simple form of the adjective. (Examples: happy, sleepy)
- 2. COMPARATIVE DEGREE OF COMPARISON: The form used to compare two things. (Examples: happier, sleepier, more beautiful, worse, better, less grumpy)
- 3. SUPERLATIVE DEGREE OF COMPARISON: The form used to compare three or more things. (Examples: happiest, sleepiest, most beautiful, worst, best, least grumpy)

#### NOTES:

- There are some modifiers that have no comparative or superlative forms; they do not vary in degree. These modifiers will be considered positive for the purposes of the game.
- If comparative or superlative is demanded, the adverbs *more*, *less*, *most*, and *least* do not need to be formed from the letters in the Letters section of the mat and/or the Resources.

EXERCISES: Underline each adjective. Under the line, write PA if it is a predicate adjective or AA if it is an adjacent adjective. Write POS, COM, or SUP if it is a positive, comparative, or superlative degree of comparison.

**1.** The <u>furriest</u> dog jumped over the <u>sleepy brown</u> fox.

Expensive follows the linking verb was, so it is a predicate adjective.

**3.** The gorillas, <u>scary</u> and <u>loud</u>, wanted to become <u>bigger</u>.

Bigger follows the linking verb become, so it is a predicate adjective.

**4.** The most <u>xanthic</u> medium, <u>xenic</u> and <u>xeric</u>, appeared more <u>xyloid</u> than this.

Xyloid follows the linking verb appeared, so it is a predicate adjective.

**5.** The <u>zippy</u>, <u>zooty</u> music seemed <u>zoppa</u>.

Zoppa follows the linking verb seemed, so it is a predicate adjective.
