Here are some points that came to me while I was looking at the Module 1 Foundations

- 1. I like the idea of posters that I can hang in my classroom to immediately communicate (whether it is a math, social studies or English class) that "this is how we read actively."
- 2. Constant improvement: At least three of the posters can benefit from tweaking. Richard Clark of USC has a "two-factor rule" for posters. The poster should somehow attract the attention of the viewer to the main idea of the poster and there should be a clear step-by-step prescription about how to put into practice the idea that the poster has displayed. The language should be simple so that a wide audience can benefit from the information. FEEDBACK to the designers of the course: Add an "additional or optional product for the graduate student to deliver so that the conduit of intrat is greased." Currently the course has two main products, after completing

- Module 1 (after approximately 7 hours of absorbing information and reflecting on the material). Why not have a mini-activity?
- 3. How to pay for the optional additional feedback. I would pay an additional \$20 per feedback session -- I've already invested nearly \$300. Why not charge \$20 for 2 mini exercises. The first session would be to print the posters, hang the posters, and make a short video demonstrating the posters to my class. This is like a book talk but it is a poster talk. "This is what I do when I see these posters. The posters remind me to be an active reader and the read actively."
 - 4. The second mini-activity would be to unpack "The domains that are included in the alignment for the framework for Teaching, described by Charlotte Danielson"



My Goals

I am a teacher. I have taught students in middle and high school and I currently want to prepare students and parents for the Mastery Transcript.

Description of the "Focus on Skills."

Over 150 private schools have joined the Mastery Transcript Consortium, which aims to switch their grading system to "badges", away from grades and grade point average.

Steve Covey wrote that we should "begin with the end in mind."

Is our goal to have students show that they are "3.52" or "2.51"? Or do we want to read that the student has demonstrated great capacities for team work and taking the initiative?

That's the challenge before us in 2019. Two years ago, Scott Looney, headmaster of the Hawken School in Cleveland, released a report at the New York State Association of Independent Schools that described the opportunity to switch away from grades to a system of min-credits, like badges. The idea is to remove time pressure and the pressure of "getting the grade" -- His report had three points that caught my attention

- 1. Mount Holyoke college started the procedure of giving grades (A to F) for school work in 1897
- 2. Looney summarized the work of Alfie Kahn, pointing out Kahn's chief point that "the pursuit of grades reduces learning."
- 3. Dershowitz "excellent sheep" book was included in Looney's report to point out that grade inflation has hit universities.

One of the most important quotes used by Looney in his report was the observation by Buckminster Fuller that the

My aim with this course is to demonstrate to parents, teachers and students that a teacher actually did the course work. You don't have to rely on the vetting system or the authority of Greenville University You don't have to depend on the State of Florida's department of teacher Certification. You can read the essays that I wrote and the work that I submitted and decide for yourself

- -- does the Dept of Education in Florida assign enough work to truly figure out if Steve should continue to be a teacher and continue to hold a teaching certificate?
- -- does the Greenville University assign enough work for the awarding of 2 Graduate credits?
- -- Should Steve's method of sharing his work become a standard or at least an alternative way to demonstrate continuing education?

INDEPENDENT ONGOING CONTINUING EDUCATION

Between 2013 and 2018, I worked with students and teachers to produce more than 50 documents and publish them on Createspace, which is now called Kindle Direct Publishing. At least twelve of those works contain words that I wrote, and contain ideas that I collected.

In 2014 I learned how to build a digital portfolio and showed the steps in Show Your Work, available as a free ebook TINYURL.com/ShowYourWork.

In 2015 I pulled the work of several students together and helped them show their abilities as authors. This led to producing a step by step guide to publishing student work TINYURL.com/sundanielmunoz You can see the link at https://www.slideshare.net/theebookman/an-eye-foraneyeinteriorforkindle and see the steps for moving forward in building a wider audience for students.

In 2016, I developed a report to principals that showed the flow from Projects to Digital Portfolio and created a free ebook called "The School Counselor's Guide to Digital Portfolios." TINYURL.com/sunDP5 another free ebook.

In 2017 I developed a short course to introduce students to projects, focusing on 32 pages to lead the students into the mindset of "I want to make a project" (a poster to attract the attention of passersby to the lyrics of a song that I respect or a quote). The steps resulted in a free ebook TINYURL.com/sunbrokenleg. It is the first guide to projects to feature the remarkable website project by Danny Yu and Luke Chang, students in Shanghai. See their project at TINYURL.com/sunNHD.

In 2018 I pulled together the best practices from High Tech High and New Tech High (in Sonoma, califl) and helped spread the link of newtechhigh.org/portfolio (which is a


Profile of Steve McCrea

Steve is a test prep tutor in Florida. He also has experience as a classroom teacher and he blogs about education. He has worked in private language schools as an ESOL teacher (he holds the CELTA English Language Teaching to Adults certificate, trained by Jeff Ahmed, who most recently was located in Texas). He has also worked in private, charter and public high schools in Florida.

He received his zzzzz . in Psychology from Penn State University, an MST in Childhood Education from Fordham University, and an MSEd in Literacy Education from Hunter College.

After completing his undergraduate degree, he began working at a trade publication called *The Wall Paper in Fort Lauderdale* (assisting vendors of wallpaper to keep up with the trends of the wallpaper industry). My first real employer, Jaent Verdeguer, helped me learn on the job and become a conduit for press releases.

He analyzed issues for a political candidate, Fran Bohnsack, who ran in 1988 for Florida State Legislature and again in 1990. He earned a master's degree program in Environmental Growth Management at Florida Atlantic University and in 1991 he qualified to work at the US Department of Energy as a "presidential intern" (it was a way for a master's degree student to get into the US government quickly). He made about \$27,000 a year and worked for 6 months in the USDOE Office of Transportation

Technologies, where he learned much about vehicles powered by alternative fuels.

He returned to Florida and substituted as a teacher in a language school (teaching English to visitors from Europe, South America and Asia) and liked the work. He earned a certificate for teaching English to Adults (CELTA) from Jeff Ahmed, EnglishInternational.org.

As an educator, Steve is interested in spreading the idea that "grades hurt learning" and "Scott Looney is right: shift to a focus on skills." Since watching Looney's presentation "Imagine a Transcript" (www.TinyURL.com/nogradesvideo), Steve has collaborated with his colleagues to create procedures to support students in learning to focus on developing skills more than pursuing grades. He works in a school that helps students who have failed classes or who have dropped out of high school. The charter school is located in Oakland Park, Florida and students can choose at any moment to work on up to five courses -- so Steve switches from math to history, science, reading skills and Spanish within a typical hour. He agrees with Dennis Littky: Let students perform their understanding with exhibitions and encourage students to talk: "Teachers listen; students talk" (Littky, The Big Picture: Education is everyone's business. See a free chapter at <u>www.TINYURL.com/LittkyChapter1</u> and hear an interview with Littky at www.TINYURL.com/LittkyRadio from National Public Radio).

Steve learned from Richard Clark (USC cogtech.usc.edu) that *learning* styles is not supported by research and that the focus of teachers should be to "build lessons on the prior knowledge of students"... not on how the lessons are delivered. His studies at Nova University in the ITDE program led him to edit a book of Dr. Fischler's commentaries, which Dr. Fischler asked to be distributed widely.
