

Dear ECCV 2026 Paper Contributor,

Congratulations once again that your paper has been accepted for ECCV 2026 and publication in the official ECCV 2026 proceedings!

As the corresponding author of one of the accepted papers, you can upload the camera-ready PDF of your paper and the source files to Springer's publishing system using Springer's Meteor tool (you will receive an email invite soon).

The deadline for the upload of the camera-ready manuscripts and source files is **27 June**. This is a hard deadline and will not be extended.

Please note that Springer's Meteor is not a submission tool, your paper was already reviewed and accepted for publication. The Meteor tool is being made available so that you can upload your final camera-ready paper and the associated source files to Springer's publishing process, and so that you can sign the required license form online.

The final version of the accepted paper will be published by Springer Nature.

All papers accepted for ECCV 2026 and planned for inclusion in the conference proceedings should already conform to Springer's guidelines, the instructions communicated by the ECCV team and via the ECCV 2026 author website.

Among other issues:

There is only one upload of content to Springer, so your first upload will be the final upload. Your paper must be complete in all respects, and it is expected that you have complied with any specific changes required during the reviewing stage.

The paper should be formatted using the same Springer LNCS style that was required for the initial submission for ECCV 2026, **and it may not exceed 15 pages excluding references, nor be less than 6 pages**. Beyond the source files for your paper, make sure that you only upload one PDF file, which should correspond exactly to your final camera-ready paper.

All author affiliations and countries must be provided for each paper within the source file. Authors cannot be added or deleted at this point. The spellings of author names and the sequence of the authors will now be fixed for the papers, and no changes are possible later.

The paper titles should match those used during the ECCV 2026 submission and review process. Any title adjustments requested as part of the review process should be applied now, in the source file, in advance of upload.

All papers that appear in your reference section should have complete information, and all papers that appear in your references should be cited within the manuscript text. Any URLs/websites that appear in the references should include the date of access of the website.

All figures and tables should be numbered, should have meaningful captions, and should be cited within the manuscript text.

Springer's production team will generate Alt Texts for papers later during the production editing stage. You will have an opportunity to check or revise these during the proofing phase.

Springer requires the authors' full set of source files, including figures, in order to carry out typesetting and generate the publication HTML and publication PDF later.

In addition, we require that the source files uploaded to the system precisely match the PDFs of the papers that are uploaded.

If the paper was formatted using LaTeX, then save all LaTeX files (sources, figures, tables, images, bib) and the PDF that exactly matches this in a folder/directory on your computer, named according to the Springer Meteor ID number (not the ID used in the paper submission process). Then please upload the folder/directory to the Springer Meteor publication portal.

If the paper was formatted using MS Word, then save both the Word file and the PDF version of the paper in a folder/directory on your computer, named according to the Springer Meteor ID number (not the ID used in the paper submission process). Then please upload the folder/directory to Meteor.

You may include Electronic Supplementary Material (ESM) with your package, i.e., any file containing text, video, code, data, etc., that is not formally part of the published paper but will be made available in SpringerLink later. If you include such material, please ensure it's in a directory or file called "Supplementary_Material" within the ZIP that separately contains your main paper PDF and its corresponding source files.

Please sign Springer's License-to-Publish (LtP) online in Meteor. In doing so you are acting as the communicating author for the Meteor upload process and later for the publisher's proofing process, and you're acting and signing on behalf of your co-authors. This step is mandatory as we require a signed LtP for all papers published. [Separately, Springer's production team will use the information in the source file to determine who is visible as the Corresponding Author of the published paper later in SpringerLink, and this can be a different coauthor.]

Once again, we require a single upload action per paper. Prior to uploading, ensure that you have compiled the final version of the paper as the Meteor system is not intended for uploading draft versions.

ECCV papers may be subject to final checks for AI-generated content, plagiarism, hallucinations, or other breaches of ECCV's and Springer Nature's requirements. This involves

employing software to automatically screen for suspected cases. Please note that papers found to violate these requirements may be rejected, even after acceptance.

After the typesetting stage, Springer's production team will contact you with the proof of the paper to review before publication. Note that you may not alter contents of the paper after upload of the camera-ready version. When you receive the version to proofread, it is only to check the correctness of the typesetting.

Again congratulations, and thank you for engaging in this process. We look forward to publishing your paper in the ECCV 2026 proceedings!
