Course Description: This course promotes critical thinking and provides students with the opportunity to develop media literacy through evaluating and analyzing media texts (film, TV, news, advertising, popular culture, and print media).

Unit One Focus: Media Literacy Guiding Questions (SL.9-10.3)

The student can/will analyze media (news, film, documentary) according to the guiding questions

- Who created this text?
- What creative techniques are used to attract my attention?
- How could this text be understood differently?
- What values, points of view, and ideologies are represented or missing from this text or influenced by the medium?
- Why was this text created and/or shared?
- Whom does this text advantage and/or disadvantage?

Timeframe
5 weeks

Unit Two Focus: Advertising, Persuasion, and Propaganda (SL.9-10.2, SL.11-12.1,SL.9-10.3)

The student can/will analyze media for persuasive techniques, bias, and purpose

Argumentation

- Target audience
- Logical fallacies
- Emotional appeals
- Graphic design/visuals

Bias

- Analyzing election cartoons and political commercials
- Contrasting coverage of issues in the media

Context

- Examine process of cultural transmission through generations
- Understand historical development of print, television, internet news
- Non-fiction genres of journalism (documentary)

Unit Three Focus: Representations of Race, Gender, Social Status, and Ideology in Media Messages (SL.9-10.3, SL.11-12.1)

Key Questions:

- How do gender, race, age and class shape our understanding of our own power or powerlessness?
- Whose voices are portrayed in the mass media and whose perspectives are omitted?
- What ideas and values are depicted in media representations?
