PISTOL PROCEDURES AND COMMANDS

Note: These "Procedures and Commands" are provided as a model. They are based on procedures and commands used by the CMP Range Staff in conducting National Matches Pistol events. You may need to make minor adaptation in order to use them for Pistol events that are conducted on your range.

COMMAND	INSTRUCTIONS/ALTERNATE ACTIONS
50-YARD SLOW-FIRE STAGE COMMANDS	
Turn targets to edge WELCOME TO THE CMP-SANCTIONED (Match Name) PISTOL MATCH. RELAY (number), (MATCH NAME). TAKE YOUR POSITIONS ON THE FIRING LINE. PLACE YOUR PISTOL BOXES ON THE BENCH. DO NOT OPEN YOUR BOXES	After calling competitors to the firing line, pistol boxes or cases must be placed on the bench. They must remain unopened until after competitors go forward and place their targets.
IS THE LINE CLEAR?	Range Officers must confirm that the line is clear.
Range Officer(s) must check each pistol box or case to be sure it is closed (any uncased pistols must have actions open with safety flags inserted).	
Turn targets to face THE LINE IS CLEAR, GO FORWARD AND PLACE A 50-YARD SLOW-FIRE TARGET.	
After competitors return to the firing line	
ARE ALL PERSONNEL BACK FROM DOWNRANGE?	Range Officers must confirm that all competitors and other personnel are back behind the firing line before proceeding.
Turn targets to edge THE RANGE IS CLEAR. SHOOTERS TO THE LINE. YOU MAY OPEN YOUR BOXES AND HANDLE YOUR PISTOLS. YOUR PREPARATION PERIOD WILL BEGIN IN TWO MINUTES.	Competitors in that relay may open their pistol boxes or cases after this command. Competitors may handle their pistols, but they may not dry fire and safety flags must remain inserted with pistol actions open until the preparation period begins.

TIME: Two (2) Minutes; after two (2) minutes YOUR THREE-MINUTE PREPARATION PERIOD Competitors may continue to prepare for firing. They BEGINS NOW. may remove safety flags, close pistol actions or dry fire. They may not load their pistols. Turn targets to face TIME: Three (3) Minutes; after three (3) minutes Turn targets to edge. THE PREPARATION PERIOD HAS ENDED. THIS STAGE WILL BE 10 SHOTS SLOW FIRE. Competitors may not insert magazines containing FIRED IN A TIME LIMIT OF 10 cartridges in their pistols until after the command MINUTES...LOAD LOAD. (Pause to give time to load) IS THE LINE READY? THE LINE IS READY If the line is not ready, command: READY ON THE RIGHT THE LINE IS NOT READY (3-5 second pause) **READY ON THE LEFT** After confirming that the line is ready, resume (3-5 second pause) commands READY ON THE FIRING LINE After 3 seconds... Turn targets to face Competitors may continue firing and reloading until they have fired ten shots. TIME: Ten (10) Minutes; after ten (10) minutes Turn targets to edge CEASE FIRE, UNLOAD, MAGAZINES OUT, SLIDES BACK. If competitors must move their equipment to a CYLINDERS OPEN, separate 25-yard firing line, instruct competitors INSERT SAFETY FLAGS, PLACE YOUR GUNS IN THE BOX PLACE PISTOLS ON THE BENCH. MAKE THE LINE CLEAR. Range Officer(s) must check each pistol to be sure it is cleared with a safety flag inserted IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE RIGHT? If the line is not clear, command: IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE LEFT? THE LINE IS NOT CLEAR. Resolve the issue then resume commands THE LINE IS CLEAR ... GO FORWARD...SCORE AND REPLACE Competitors must go forward with scorecards and TARGETS WITH A 25-YARD TIMED-FIRE new targets (or pasters). Competitors may score to TARGET. MOVE YOUR TARGETS (OR their left—pass scorecards to their right or odd-even **EQUIPMENT) TO THE 25-YARD LINE.** firing point competitors can exchange scorecards and score. Turn targets to face

After all personnel are back from downrange, continue with the timed/rapid-fire commands below.

25-YARD TIMED/RAPID-FIRE STAGE COMMANDS

THE RANGE IS CLEAR ...

Turn targets to edge

TAKE YOUR POSITIONS ON THE LINE...YOU MAY HANDLE YOUR PISTOLS.

After authorizing competitors to handle their pistols, allow a brief delay for competitors to take their positions, handle their pistols and prepare for firing.

If firing is done on a range where competitors must close their pistol boxes and move forward to the 25-yard line for timed and rapid-fire series, the commands should be:

THE RANGE IS CLEAR...TAKE YOUR POSITIONS...YOU MAY UNBOX AND HANDLE YOUR PISTOLS. (allow approximately one minute for competitors to unbox their pistols and set up their firing points)...YOU MAY HANDLE YOUR PISTOLS.

TIME: 30 to 60 seconds

THIS STAGE WILL BE TWO 5-SHOT TIMED-FIRE/RAPID-FIRE SERIES, WITH A TIME LIMIT OF 20/10 SECONDS PER SERIES

WITH FIVE ROUNDS...LOAD

IS THE LINE READY? THE LINE IS READY READY ON THE RIGHT

(3-5 second pause)

READY ON THE LEFT

(3-5 second pause)

READY ON THE FIRING LINE

After 3 seconds...

Turn targets to face

If this is a .22 Rimfire Pistol EIC Match, remind competitors that the timed and rapid-fire ready position is with the pistol held down at a 45-degree angle and that competitors must be in the ready position (as defined by Rule 6.1.1 b) at the command **READY ON THE FIRING LINE**.

Competitors may not insert magazines containing cartridges in their pistols until after the command

LOAD

If the line is not ready, command:

THE LINE IS NOT READY

After confirming that the line is ready, resume commands.

Competitors must be in the prescribed ready position as defined in Rule 6.1.1 at the command **READY ON THE FIRING LINE**.

TIME: 20 or 10 seconds; after 20 or 10 seconds

Turn targets to edge CEASE FIRE, ARE THERE ANY SAVED ROUNDS OR REFIRES? I SEE NONE (OR) THERE ARE REFIRES ON POINT (point numbers) UNLOAD, MAGAZINES OUT, SLIDES BACK, CYLINDERS OPEN	If a competitor has a malfunction during a 5-shot series, they must keep the pistol pointed downrange without attempting to clear it and raise their non-shooting hand. A Range Officer must determine if any malfunction is ALLOWABLE or NON-ALLOWABLE. Competitors may keep pistols in their hands between series.
Targets remain edged THIS WILL BE YOUR SECOND TIMED/RAPID-FIRE SERIES. WITH FIVE ROUNDSLOAD	Competitors may not insert magazines containing cartridges in their pistols until after the command LOAD
IS THE LINE READY? THE LINE IS READY READY ON THE RIGHT (3-5 second pause) READY ON THE LEFT (3-5 second pause) READY ON THE FIRING LINE After 3 seconds	If the line is not ready, command: THE LINE IS NOT READY After confirming that the line is ready, resume commands Competitors must be in the prescribed ready position as defined in Rule 5.1.1 at the command READY ON THE FIRING LINE.
Turn targets to face	
TIME: 20 or 10 seconds; after 20 or 10 seconds	

Turn targets to edge CEASE FIRE, ARE THERE ANY SAVED ROUNDS OR REFIRES?

If a competitor has a malfunction during a 5-shot series, they must keep the pistol pointed downrange without attempting to clear it and raise their non-shooting hand.

I SEE NONE (OR) THERE ARE REFIRES ON POINT (point numbers)

A Range Officer must determine if any malfunction is ALLOWABLE or NON-ALLOWABLE.

UNLOAD, MAGAZINES OUT, SLIDES BACK, CYLINDERS OPEN. PLACE YOUR PISTOLS ON THE BENCH OR IN THE BOX. MAKE THE LINE CLEAR. After clearing pistols all competitors who are not firing refires must bench their pistols and step back from the firing line.

IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE RIGHT?

THE LINE IS CLEAR

25 YARD TIMED/RAPID-FIRE ALIBI SERIES

Targets remain edged

THE NEXT COMMANDS ARE REFIRE SHOOTER(S) ONLY

THIS WILL BE THE TIMED-FIRE/RAPID-FIRE SERIES

FOR YOUR ALIBI TIMED/RAPID-FIRE SERIES...WITH FIVE ROUNDS...LOAD

IS THE LINE READY? THE LINE IS READY READY ON THE RIGHT

(3-5 second pause)

READY ON THE LEFT

(3-5 second pause)

READY ON THE FIRING LINE

After 3 seconds...

Turn targets to face

The Range Officer may announce the firing points that are authorized to refire.

Competitors may not insert magazines containing cartridges in their pistols until after the command **LOAD**.

If the line is not ready, command:

THE LINE IS NOT READY

After confirming that the line is ready, resume commands.

TIME: 20 or 10 seconds; after 20 or 10 seconds

Turn targets to edge.

CEASE FIRE, UNLOAD, MAGAZINES OUT,

SLIDES BACK, CYLINDERS OPEN INSERT SAFETY FLAGS,

PLACE PISTOLS ON THE BENCH OR IN THE BOX.

MAKE THE LINE CLEAR.

Range Officer(s) must check each pistol to be sure it is cleared with a safety flag inserted.

IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE RIGHT?
IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE LEFT?

If the line is not clear, command: **THE LINE IS NOT CLEAR**.

After confirming that the line is clear, resume commands.

THE LINE IS CLEAR...
GO FORWARD...SCORE AND REPLACE
TARGETS

Competitors must go forward with scorecards and new targets/target centers (and pasters).

Competitors may score to their left—pass scorecards to their right.

Turn targets to face

After all personnel are back from downrange: If the stage just completed was the timed-fire stage, continue with the rapid-fire stage by returning to the start of the **TIMED AND RAPID-FIRE COMMANDS**; if the stage just completed was the rapid-fire stage, continue with the final commands below.

THE LINE IS CLEAR...PLACE YOUR PISTOLS IN YOUR BOX...SECURE YOUR BOX.
MAKE THE LINE CLEAR.

IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE RIGHT?
IS THE LINE CLEAR ON THE LEFT?

THE LINE IS CLEAR

GO FORWARD AND SCORE. BOTH THE SCORER AND COMPETITOR MUST SIGN THE SCORECARD. SIGNED SCORECARDS MUST BE TURNED IN TO THE RANGE OFFICER BY THE SCORERS.

RELAY (#), REMOVE YOUR EQUIPMENT FROM YOUR FIRING POINT AND POLICE YOUR BRASS AND TRASH.

All pistols must be boxed or cased or have actions open and safety flags inserted before they can be removed from the firing line.
