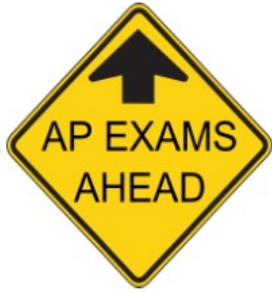


Welcome Spring!

Be sure to bring these:

- No. 2 pencils for your multiple-choice answer sheet.
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- An [acceptable calculator](#) if your AP Exam allows the use of a calculator.
- A current government-issued or school-issued photo ID.

AP Testing Cont. :

Don't bring these:

- Electronic equipment including phones, smartwatches, fitness trackers, wearable technology, cameras, recording or listening devices, or any other type of electronic or communication device.
 - The only exceptions to the above restrictions are laptops or other devices specifically permitted to be used for in-school digital testing.
 - School-owned and school-controlled digital recording devices are allowed only for the AP French, AP German, AP Italian, and AP Spanish Language and Culture Exams, and the AP Music Theory Exam.
- Books, reference guides, notes, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, pencils that are not No. 2, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or colored pencils.
- Scratch paper: Students testing in-school are prohibited from bringing scratch paper to the AP Exam, but scratch paper will be provided.
- Watches that beep, make a noise, or have an alarm.
- Computers or calculators that are not approved.
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Ear plugs.
- Clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- Food or drink.
- Clipboards.

AP Test Results:

Students can indicate in My AP the college, university or scholarship program they'd like to receive their score report for free.

Students indicate this information only through My AP.

The deadline for students to indicate or change their fee score report recipient is June 20, 2021.

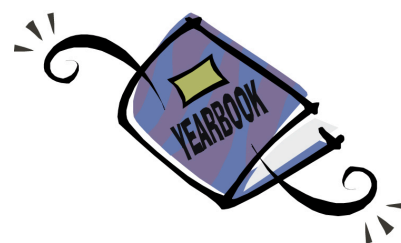
Girls Track and Field

ACT Scores

Junior students who did not request that their ACT scores be sent to at least ONE college before testing will be receiving a voucher to send their scores to up to FOUR colleges. This voucher will arrive when students receive their paper results - sometime in April. Please make sure to follow the directions included with your score report. This only applies to students who did not select ANY colleges. If junior students did not create an ACT account, they will need their ACT ID which is printed on their paper score report to create their account and then send their scores. See Ms. Groh with questions.



WHAT: ACT Aspire is a powerful tool to help students and their parents assess current skill levels and monitor progress toward a successful ACT test which is taken during the junior year. The Aspire test assesses students' readiness in five areas covered by the ACT test: English, math, reading, science and writing.

WHO: All 9th and 10th Graders, including OC Virtual Students

WHEN: Wednesday, April 14, 7:30am - 2:45pm

WHERE: The NGC and 10-12 buildings will be open only to the 9th and 10th graders to allow for smaller testing rooms and social distancing. Students should remember to be masked. They should also bring their fully charged, updated chromebook; pen/pencil; photo ID; and calculator (optional). All other items, including cell phones, should be left at home or in their lockers. Juniors and Seniors who are not testing will be required to complete asynchronous assignments at home on this day.



2021 Senior Graduation Information

Graduation Ceremony: The 2021 Graduation ceremony is scheduled for Saturday, June 19th at American Family Field at 10:00 am. The informational letter and ticket order form were mailed to the graduate's primary address on March 12th. The ticket order is due no later than Friday, April 16th. Only one form will be accepted per graduate so if there are two households, they must be on the same order form.

Graduation Tickets: Graduation tickets will be handed out during an assembly on Wednesday, May 19th during senior advisories. If you are unable to attend the assembly, please stop by the office to sign for your tickets anytime after this event. Early graduates are welcome to pick up their tickets during the assembly or in the office.
