In the Stewards Hall, Seaven turkey worke chairs, two turkey worke Stools, one greene velvett Stoole, five turkey leather chairs, one longe table, one Eight Square table, one ovell

One Suite of buffe culler Curtins & vallens & Counterpaine of the Same, one Steynd callicoe quilt, Seaven and twentie pewter dishes, one Cullender, two bed panns, foure Close Stoole panns, one pewter plate for to lay cheese on, five Sawcers, two CandleSticks, four Saults, three Stands of pewter, all this besids the rest of the pewter that is to be chainged, three brass potts, one Cettle, foure Scelletts⁵⁸, one greate flower potte, one paire of doggs with brasses on the tops, three paire with broad brasses, two paire of Iron doggs, one other paire with brasses //:

In Marys charge, ten high brass CandleSticks, Tenn brass hande CandleSticks, Twentie Chamber potts, five basons of pewter, three warmeing pans //:
