SECOND CHARACTER	If you need to include stage directions within the dialogue, integrate them within square brackets <i>[LIKE THIS]</i> .
FIRST CHARACTER	If you view Table Properties, the table itself should be centre-aligned to the page. Column 1 should have a width of 2cm, and Column 2 a width of 8.2cm.
