MAPLEWOOD FLATS JOB POSTING: Digital Production Coordinator Summer Student Position

Part-time (20hrs/wk), 14 weeks, June 7 to September 5, 2021

Are you a digital tech production wizard who loves to pull off top notch virtual and live events? The Digital Production Coordinator will manage all aspects of producing and archiving with Zoom, simulcast to Facebook, Youtube, Instagram, and WordPress. With approximately 10 educational activities per month based at the Maplewood Flats Nature House, the Coordinator will facilitate the delivery of an online roster of programs and events. Working closely with the senior staff team, programs staff and Programs Committee to plan and schedule programs and presentations, the Digital Production Coordinator will deliver a robust online experience to the general public.

Background: The area has been occupied by Səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh) and Coast Salish People since time immemorial. Prior to settler contact and industrialization, the region featured contiguous mudflats across Burrard Inlet. Since 1993, on these lands and flats, the WBT has been managing the North Shore's only wild bird sanctuary with 5km of trails, nursery, and nature house. The Indigenous knowledge of wild birds and Coast Salish culture in this public space signals a collaborative path forward where the local ways of knowing are honoured and shared in culturally appropriate ways. In this way, Maplewood Flats' programs connect Coast Salish culture with the greater Vancouver public and promote reconciliation and redress.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- As online production tech, ensure support to produce and host virtual workshops, webinars, broadcasts and livestreamed events.
- Research and develop creative approaches to program delivery and ways to make the content interactive and enhance the user experience.
- Organize, and manage the video archives so that they are available as a resource to the broader public.
- Pending changing COVID19 public health directives, develop associated streaming and live experiences, such as walking trails adjacent to Burrard Inlet, and sharing birding and conservation and reconciliation programming.

Knowledge and skills:

- Experience in online and live event and educational program production
- Strong communication skills and proficiency with online MS Office including Excel, plus eventbrite, zoom, social media and digital communications (e.g facebook, twitter, instagram)
- Final year of a BA in Communications, Environmental Science, PR, or related fields. Or be pursuing a Master's Degree.
- Excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to build strong, collaborative relationships.
- Ability to work effectively with minimal supervision, organize work independently, as well as work with the team.
- Experience training staff, volunteers on using new digital tools is an asset

Eligibility: be between 19 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment; be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*; and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.
