

### Collectiveness as Architectural Form


How can architecture as a 'whole' be broken down into 'individual' elements? How do a series of 'individual' elements in architecture form a 'whole'? Should these 'individual' elements be homogeneous? Can they be heterogeneous? How can these elements be connected and separated? What kind of hierarchy or order would help define their organization? Can a specific organizational logic in architecture be extended to the city? Conversely, can the organizational logic of the city penetrate into architecture? Should architecture, as independent and individual 'whole' within urban fabric, take on a specific form? What impact might specific architectural strategies have on the physical and social systems of the city?

This semester, the studio begins with these series of questions.

The articulation of 'Collectiveness as Architectural Form' will be structured around architectural 'type & typology' and the concept of 'vernacular'. Type & Typology will serve as a design tool for extracting abstract ideas and developing them into architectural strategies. Students will analyze existing architectural types from various perspectives such as structure, geometry, and circulation, challenge them, develop strategies, and discover new architectural types.

The concept of 'Vernacular' will be addressed in the materialization of these new architectural types. Each student will identify the most urgent urban, socio-cultural, and environmental issues surrounding their chosen site and define their own 'Vernacular'. These elements may be physical or non-physical, with non-physical elements potentially defining new physical conditions, or physical conditions creating new socio-cultural contexts.

The interplay between abstraction through Type & Typology and materialization through Vernacular will lead to further articulation. Each project will be concluded with an 'Idea for the City,' serving as a manifesto that integrates the architectural proposal into the city.





# Type & Typology


'To raise the question of typology in architecture is to raise a question of the nature of the architectural work itself.'

This is the opening sentence of the essay 'On Typology' written by the architect Rafael Moneo in 1978. Here, type is not a criterion for classifying buildings according to use or program, but can be defined as a concept that is the essence of the form / structure / functionality of architecture. Adopting Type & Typology as a tool for understanding architecture and cities means exploring the most fundamental elements that lead certain structures to function in certain ways. Through this process, a design strategy could be developed through the evolution and transformation of abstract types and the city is understood as an aggregate of types.


In 2024, the studio's agenda expands itself by adding the concept of 'Vernacular' to Rafael Moneo's 1978 statement.



Plans for porches Jean-Nicolas-Louis Durand 1809



### The Vernacular

'A Borderless Planet' has recently encountered the phenomenon of 'Tightened physical Borders' due to the Covid-19 pandemic, climate change caused by global warming, and wars in Russia and the Middle East. While technological advances and active exchanges have kept non-physical boundaries still blurred, and the appearance of major cities has become similar worldwide, the physical movement of people and resources is no longer as free as it once was.

In this context, how should the concept of 'Vernacular' be applied? The materialization of abstract types through the idea of 'Vernacular' should be an architectural strategy. This process will consider the urban, social, cultural, and economic aspects of the region as identified by each student. Specific structural or material systems may be experimented in this process. Students will be encouraged to create a series of fragment models to test their ideas both digitally and physically.





### **Teaching Methods**

방법// 교육부와 학교본부의 방침에 따라 변경될 수 있으나, 대면수업을 위주로 진행한다.

Studio course consists of face-to-face lectures, individual tutorials, seminars, workshops, presentations and field trips. The 16-week class will be conducted in three stages: Briefing, Type & Typology, and Architecture of the City.

- Briefing: Create your own project brief based on the site research/analysis and case studies. Related text seminars and drawing workshops will be conducted in parallel.
- Type & Typology: The precedents collected from research are synthesized and analyzed typologically to extract abstract forms of 'Type', to establish design strategies leading to develop architectural design. Produce drawings and models using 2D/3D tools. Experimentation with a variety of materials and methods is encouraged.
- Architecture of the City: Abstract types are materialized through the idea of Vernacular. The resulting architectural proposals are then tested within the urban context. A vision for the city will be represented strategically through models or collages. If necessary, model making workshops can be conducted.

### **Expected Outcome**

A portfolio filled with deliverables for each stage, such as research, case study analysis, drawings and physical models will be the final output. The key drawings, a series of fragment models and the collage of Idea for the City will follow the studio-specific format, which has important value as the result of not only individual work but also the collective work of the studio. \*Students are expected to produce high quality drawings and well-crafted physical models. Please review your skills and try to improve if necessary.
