- Each session costs \$CAD 15 per session.
- Monies collected for this game will [go to schools](#) in [Uganda](#) and [Nepal](#).
- We do offer a full refund on your first session if you are not satisfied.
- If you miss the session and do not inform me about it, your money will not be refunded.
- If you inform me that you cannot make the session, I will put your payment on hold.
- If you miss three sessions in a row, your place will be taken in the game.

The Schools You'll Support

Both of our schools were built in consultations with the local elders.

One of the problems the local communities had was that kids would complete their public elementary education and still be illiterate.

To help combat this we built these schools to act as a kindergarten of sorts so that the kids would have a firm grasp on their ABCs, 123s and so on so at lease that could have a running start when they enter elementary school.
