- Would probably just ignore it
- If I felt passionately, would rather upvote other comments (to bury this comment)
- Doesn't want to interact directly
- Would report if anything
- Hesitant to do this cuz username is involved
- I don't know what the different types of reply guy are
- If I was aware of the bot and subreddit, maybe it aligns with goals
- Good to see examples
- But I wouldn't feel inclined to use this bot
- Don't think this method would discourage
- People are mean enough to post in the first place, so they might feel good about being reposted
- No clear punishment or education for reply guys in particular
- Concerned that this might actually encourage this behavior
- Feels that anonymous would've felt better
- See people trying to trace these comments back to instigate conflict —> concern
