



Eligibility

Scholastic eligibility, as set forth by the Douglas County Middle School Athletic Guidelines, requires that any student who participates in athletics and/or activities must be eligible prior to participation.

Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• All letter grades in Infinite Campus must reflect passing marks. This means an A, B, or C in all classes, including Advisory.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ One letter grade of D is permissible - two or more Ds or any Is makes a student ineligible.• Students must not have a behavior incident resulting in a suspension one week prior to competition or event.• Students must not have a day of truancy one week prior to competition or event.• Students must be present for half a day of school (arrive by 11:30) in order to participate.• Participants may practice.• Each participant is expected to conduct himself/herself according to all rules and regulations of the school.• If an event is scheduled for a non-school day, the participant must be in accordance with these rules on the preceding day.• All athletic participants must abide by the Athletic Code of Conduct and the District Code of Conduct.• All activity participants must abide by the District Code of Conduct.
Process	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grades checked one day prior to competition or event.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ Athletic and activities coordinator will pull grades from Infinite Campus and give to coaches or activities sponsors.◦ Participants should utilize opportunities during Advisory to check their grades and work with teachers to raise non-passing grades in advance of the grade pull.• An administrator shall have the authority to declare a student ineligible for participating in competitions or events based on inappropriate behavior.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ A student can be ineligible for irregular attendance, discipline or academic reasons.• An administrator shall have the authority to make individual student recommendations for Special Education or At-Risk students.• Coaches, sponsors and/or parents or guardians may adopt a stricter policy but may not be more lenient.
