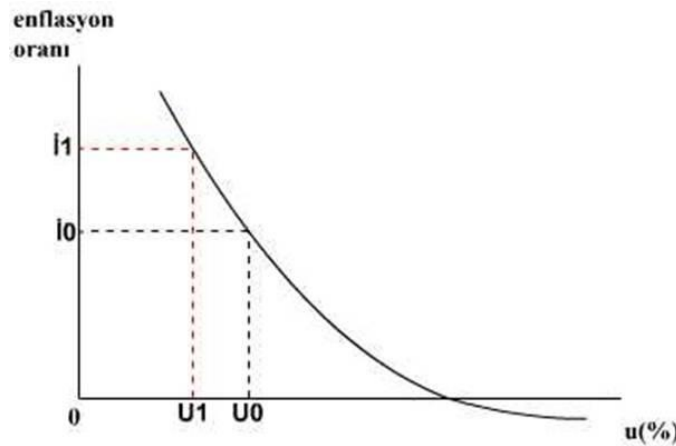


Figure 1. The First Letter of Each Word in the Figure Name Must Be Capitalized

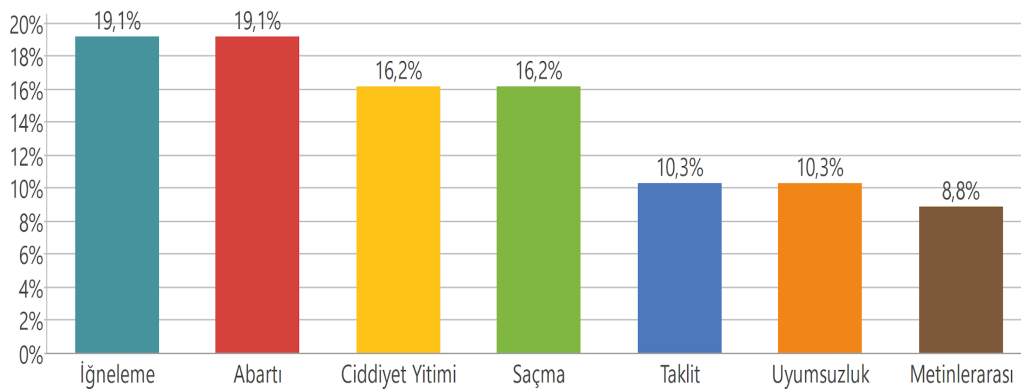


Chart 1. Chart Title

Tables corresponding to the end of the page should be left as they are if they are not visually distorted. Sub-headings should not be left separate from the headline and table. Tables, figures, graphics and similar parts should not be visually strained, and if possible, they should be aligned with each other. The headings in the tables are on the table.
