What To Look For In A Waxing Specialist Near You

With so many spas offering body waxing, how can you pick the right one for you? Here is what to look for in a professional waxing specialist:

1. Customer Reviews

Reading customer reviews on Google, Yahoo, Facebook, and Yelp is one of the most significant ways to identify the quality of a waxing specialist. Whether good or bad, reading someone else's first-hand testimony is powerful social proof. You may also get additional helpful information from advocacy groups like Consumer Reports and the Better Business Bureau.

2. License

Before booking a waxing appointment, double-check that the staff has the necessary licenses and certificates. It would help if you worked with a licensed esthetician. During training alone, these specialists generally clock about 1,000 hours of body, face, and bikini waxing experience! As a result, you can trust that they have the knowledge and expertise to give a safe and successful waxing session.

A state license is available to estheticians who have completed their training and passed all applicable examinations. Certifications are awarded by training institutions, trade schools, and government bodies upon completing a training program. In most states, however, an esthetician cannot work until they have received their license. On the other hand, certification is an acceptable alternative in states where there are no licensing requirements. A certificate acts as proof of your technician's training and competency in this scenario.

3. Good Hygiene

Observing the details can teach you a lot. For example, is the facility clean and well-organized, or is it filthy and cluttered? Do the technicians use gloves during the procedure? Are they sterilizing equipment and instruments in between uses, as well? These are all the information that you should keep in mind. For example, it could jeopardize your health if the staff does not change their gloves between clients or uses unpackaged instruments.

4. Competent And Caring Staff

Unfortunately, not all waxing services prioritize their customers. Some business owners are solely focused on profit while the grade of care deteriorates. You could leave the spa with skin injuries, scars, or infections if the clinic doesn't practice "safe waxing" or isn't sensitive to your needs.
