ELLIE-ROMAN NUMERALS

Graphic of basic numerals

I=1[a single digit]

V=5[a graphic representing 5 fingers]

X=10[the fingers of 2 hands joined]

L=50[adapted from catholic sign]

C=100[adapted from a chalcidic sign;also the first letter for the word hundred “centum”]

D=500[half of chalcidic sign which represented one thousand]

M=1,000[the first letter for thousand “mille”]

The Romans did not use the same place value that we use today. There are seven letters that the Romans used making numeral groups. We all still use Roman numerals today like on those fancy clocks in the olympic games and super bowl and many more things.
