ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) POTENTIAL

PSAT scores help identify your potential success in Advanced Placement classes offered at Cranford High School. The AP program gives students the opportunity to take college level courses while still in high school. After taking an AP course, students can take the corresponding AP exam which could earn them valuable college credit and placement. You may have received an email already from College Board identifying courses in which your teen could demonstrate success. Please go to: www.Collegeboard.org -> Sign in -> Student Score Reports -> AP Potential. The number of **green dots** shows your student's potential and then choose from a drop down menu

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to see how each AP course matches up with different majors. Please explore course options and contact your school counselor if you have any questions!

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMS will be administered from May 4 through May 15, 2026. The cost is \$99 per exam. You may late register beginning November 16, 2025 through March 1, 2026 by going to <https://aptsusa.com/cranford/>.

SENIORS.....JANUARY 1 DEADLINE FOR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Seniors...if you are applying to a college with a January 1 deadline, if you haven't already, you must see your counselor immediately. **The deadline was Monday, December 10** (10 school days prior to the college's application deadline) in order to allow ample time to send out the necessary paperwork. The CHS School Counseling office will be closed for the winter break.

SENIORS: COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Parents must first complete the [PARENT/GUARDIAN CONSENT TO SEND TRANSCRIPTS FORM](#)

- Beginning **August 1**, Common Application at <http://www.commonapp.org> is open.
- Unofficial transcripts were mailed home in July. It includes Freshman, Sophomore and Junior year courses and grades.
- The list of courses is a guide to help you complete college applications. In order to apply to all colleges, an **official** transcript must be sent through the CHS School Counseling Office beginning in September.

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LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION FOR SENIORS

If you haven't done so already, please see your teachers in person to request a letter of recommendation. You should then follow up with the requests through Naviance by clicking on COLLEGES -> COLLEGES Home -> scroll to Letters of Recommendation under the Apply to Colleges banner -> Add Request -> select teacher from the dropdown -> select the specific college. Colleges must be entered into Colleges I'm Applying To before requesting letters.

SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Students may drop a course only with permission of their parents and a completed form.
- No schedule changes will be allowed during the first ten days of school, with the exception of course level errors.
- Students making level changes mid-marking period will have their grade calculation reflective of the time spent in the dropped class and the new class.
- Grade weighting is given to final grades only in honors and AP classes.
- Students who drop a course may be assigned to study hall. Early release and later arrival are not permitted in the case of a dropped subject without administrative approval. Seniors are not allowed more than the equivalent of a full year study hall in an academic school year.

- Change levels through Course Waiver Form

Schedule Change Window #3 (beginning the eleventh day of school: (September 18, 2025)

- Change levels: teacher initiated only

Schedule Change Window #4 (beginning the sixth week of first semester: (October 16 - October 23, 2025)

- Change levels: teacher and/or student initiated
- Drop a first semester elective and add a study hall for the first semester
- Drop a full year course and add a study hall for the first semester and add second semester elective

Schedule Change Window #5 (end of marking period one: (November 11 - November 18, 2025)

- Change levels: teacher and/or student initiated

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- Drop a first semester elective and add a study hall for the first semester
- Drop a full year course and add a study hall for the first semester and add second semester course
- Marking Period One grade will be recorded on the report card from the dropped class
- Dropped courses will result in a W/P (Withdrawal Passing) or W/F (Withdrawal Failing) recorded on student's transcript

SCHEDULE CHANGE MEETING: JANUARY 22, 2026

Schedule Change Window #6 (beginning the end of marking period two: (January 29 - February 5, 2026)

- Change levels: teacher and/or student initiated
- Drop a full year course and add a study hall or an elective for the second semester course
- Grade calculation: Marking Periods One and Two will be recorded on the report card from the dropped class

Schedule Change Window #7 (beginning the sixth week of marking period 3: (March 12 - March 19, 2026)

- Change levels: teacher and/or student initiated
- Drop a second semester elective and add a study hall for the second semester
- Drop a full year course and add a study hall for the second semester
- Dropped courses will result in a W/P (Withdrawal Passing) or W/F (Withdrawal Failing) recorded on student's transcript

Schedule Change Window #8 (beginning of the end of marking period 3: (April 9, 2026 - April 16, 2026)

- Drop a second semester elective and add a study hall for the second semester
- Drop a full year course and add a study hall for the second semester
- Courses dropped will result in a W/F recorded on the student's transcript.
