

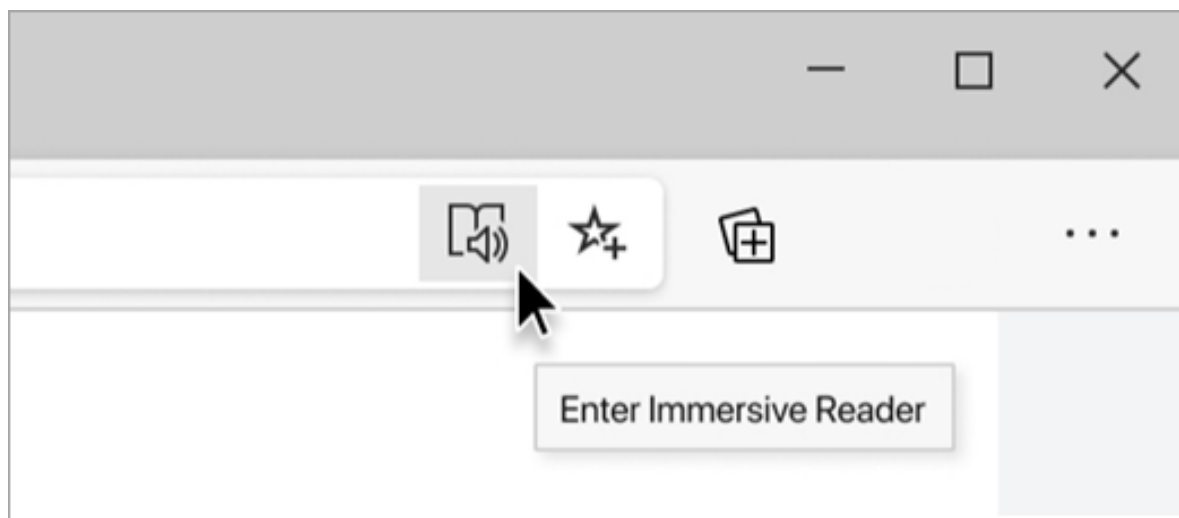
Immersive Reader

Immersive Reader is a new Microsoft technology that is integrated into Microsoft Office and the new Edge browser; it implements proven techniques to improve reading and writing, such as read aloud, parts of speech labeling, syllabification, and translations.

Microsoft Edge

The Immersive Reader is built-in to the new Microsoft Edge browser and is installed on all school-issued Windows and Apple computers. The Immersive Reader icon will appear in the URL bar when a website can be read using Immersive Reader. Try a Wikipedia article to test it out.

Background [edit]

The school was established in 1958 and is named for Thomas Kiely Gorman, the fourth bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Dallas from 1954 to 1964. At the time of its founding, the school was within the boundaries of the Diocese of Dallas. The eastern portion of the Diocese of Dallas was ceded to the Diocese of Tyler, which was established in 1987.

Located on 30 acres (120,000 m²) in south Tyler, the school's campus features a main classroom building, Saints Peter and Paul Chapel, two gyms, a fine arts center, McCallum Stadium, the renovated Holy Family Library, as well as numerous sports fields. It has been ranked as "The 50 Best Catholic High Schools in America" by U.S. News & World Report.
