1. Welcome and Introduction of the Chair of the Regional Council

The 76th BC/Yukon Regional Council meeting began at 9:01 am Pacific Time. Regional Director Robert MacDonald welcomed delegates to this year's Council:

BC/Yukon is the first region to provide a virtual Regional Council. BC is starting to ease the pandemic/COVID-19 restrictions through the BC Restart Plan. We acknowledge the impact this health crisis has had on everyone and those that had suffered a loss and illness during this time.

This is a unique event and delegates are making history by attending today. It was really important to the Regional Executive to not miss a second year of Regional Council. This is an essential and paired down version of Council. Next year we will likely be back to a normal, in-person Council with a full agenda.

We appreciate your patience today over Zoom and we send out an appreciation out to those in the region helping our members, the Regional Executive, Regional Staff and Chair Dan Jones.

<u>Introductions</u>

Chair Dan Jones introduced members of the Regional Executive, President Debi Daviau, Regional Office and National Office staff.

The Chair provided introductory comments and instructions including how Zoom will work during Council, the Virtual Binder location and general procedures. He also indicated Philip Mantler as the Parliamentarian for Council who was monitoring the chat and as per the National Elections Policy, since the Notice of Regional Council did not include any provisions for campaigning, all such activities are completely prohibited during these proceedings. He then introduced Jason Duguay (National Office IT staff) who provided further Zoom instructions.

Equity Statement/Indigenous Land Acknowledgement

Karen Hall read the Indigenous Land acknowledgement. Ken Antao read the a statement on equity encompassing the principle that all union members are equal and deserve mutual respect.

2. Call to Order

The Chair convened the 76th Regional Council to order at 9:15 am Pacific Time.

6. PIPSC Update – Guest Speaker President Debi Daviau

President Daviau advised we have approximately 60,000 members and 47 professional groups. We represent IT experts, Scientists, Auditors, Commerce & Purchasing, Engineers, Health Professionals, Provincial members and Others. The top 5 things we do for our members are negotiate salaries and working conditions, workplace representation, legal defense, government relations and mobilization and communications. Our top current issues are return to safe workplaces (COVID-19), defending our members' pensions, defending public science, Next Generation Pay System (NextGen), contracting out, tax fairness, equity, diversity and inclusiveness and organizing and growing our union. President Daviau discussed each top current issue in detail. We are amplifying our message through mobilization and digital engagement, government relations, civil society partners and media relations.

A Question and Answer Session held.

10. Regional Director's Report

Robert MacDonald expressed that it is his sincere honor to provide his report to the 76th BC/Yukon Regional Council. Being the Regional Director since 2015 has been an incredible privilege and an absolute highlight of his 33+ years in the public service of Canada. If anyone wants to try and make a difference in their community should consider running for this position (Regional Director). While it is a lot of work, it is a lot of fun and can be very rewarding. One of the highlights of the Director position is all the incredible members you get to meet throughout the BC/Yukon region.

It would be an understatement to say so much has happened since our 75th Regional Council in Burnaby in 2019. Words cannot express the monumental changes that occurred since that time. Due to the pandemic, we did not hold a Regional Council in 2020 and so this year we are holding our 76th session.

Thank you to our stewards, activists and labour leaders for their time, effort and commitment to PIPSC, this region and its members. We can't understatement the amount of time and volunteer effort that many individuals have put into this organization. We would not be able to operate as a union without the incredible support, time and dedication of these individuals. Robert also extended an appreciation to members' friends, family and loved ones who sacrificed their time to cover for them while they attended events and looked after union duties.

Thank you to our Regional Executive – Philip Mantler, Carl Cahoon, Karen Hall, Peter MacDougall, Ken Antao, Adele McLean and Philip Tam. Over the past few years they have continued to meet mostly in the evenings. They did a lot including to planning, reviewing and to keeping things moving during this most peculiar time. This group did more than just keep the lights on. We had a lot of great discussions and really started to create a positive culture going forward for this organization. Robert congratulated those who ran today and acknowledged that they will be a huge contribution to this organization and thanked them in advance for your time.

This region would be lost without the incredible support and devotion of our regional office staff. As many of you know, since 2019, two of our greatest stars retired – Ernie McLean (Regional Manager) and Cynthia Pang (Office Administrator). Soon another one in a million star will be retiring – Harinder Mahil

(Team Lead). We continue to receive outstanding service from our new Regional Manager Kris Hawkins and the team at the regional office – Shira Gordon, Patricia Fung, Dulce Cuenca, Simon Cott and John Ehinger. It has been an incredible pleasure to work with the regional office staff. From the first day I started, I was welcomed with open arms and really tried to forge a partnership. We strive to be the best region and there is an incredible culture of excellence in the regional office whether it's serving members, putting on events or getting notices out. The office has been nothing but top-rate and we thank them for that.

Thank you to Debi Daviau for attending today and she has been a great supporter.

Prior to the pandemic, we had made great strides in our community outreach and steward recruitment program. In 2019, outreach sessions were held at 8 different locations done by your Regional Executive. The Executive went out to people in the community, held lunch and learns and dinners and tried to generate interest in the union in some of the smaller locations such as Agassiz, Chilliwack and Prince Rupert. We saw the largest net increase in stewards in over 10 years because of those events. However, due to retirements and suspension of our outreach initiatives due to the pandemic, our total number of stewards are at a net decrease. Since 2010, we are down 48 stewards, 41% of our stewards overall. As previously noted, like many areas of the public service, we have an aging steward population. Currently 48% of our steward population are 50 years and older and we can only anticipate in the coming years we are going to see a lot more retirements and the steward numbers are going to drop. We are finally starting to realize some gender parity with our stewards 49 years and younger which is a huge sign that we are trying to be much more attractive to the different demographics in our organization but we have so much more work to do in this area but we see some encouraging improvement. Recruitment of our stewards will be a huge initiative for everyone. The virtual outreach has not been successful and we will be reinstituting our in-person efforts as soon as we can and continue to attract new stewards to join our region.

As for training and development, in 2019 we had three successful Basic Steward Training sessions including one just for stewards in the BC First Nations Health Authority (BCFNHA). We were able to increase the BCFNHA stewards from 0 to up to 8 stewards. We held a well-received Steward Council in Victoria and we combined this event with the Young Professionals Forum which led to some steward and executive recruitment. We finished off with Leadership Training (formerly Executive Training).

Robert was proud to say that in 2020 and 2021 the BC/Yukon region has been the leader in moving toward virtual events. This included Virtual Basic Steward Training, Virtual Advanced Labour School, Virtual Steward and Better Together

Sessions and the Virtual Steward Speaker Series. We are looking forward to some excitement in the fall of 2021 and hopefully over the next coming months we will better understand the requirements and begin to start planning for upcoming events. Rob thanked the regional office who took a leadership role in allowing us to move to the virtual delivery model.

Robert indicated his detailed reports are produced for each Regional Executive meeting and they can be found on the region's website page and encouraged everyone to review them over the coming months. He has really enjoyed communicating to the members in this fashion via his reports and it has given him a chance to express some of his thoughts and feelings on his final months in this position. Thank you to those who have provided feedback, it is really encouraging and it is always good to know whether you are on the right track.

Dean Corda (Vancouver Branch) spoke regarding the resolution: In solidarity with Unite Here and joining the BC Teachers Federation, BCGEU, PSAC of BC and others we must hit the Hilton (and Pacific Gateway) where it hurts. Telling them that we won't bring our business to them would demonstrate our support of their decision to deny their staff the ability to return to their jobs. As stated in the resolution, many of those workers are women and belong to

diversity groups and have been very negatively affected during this pandemic and I urge you to support this motion.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT that the Hilton Vancouver Metrotown Hotel and Pacific Gateway Hotel at Vancouver Airport be struck from the list of properties considered for PIPSC events.

Keep an eye on the region's website page because as part of our 100th anniversary celebration, each region was partnered with Tree Canada to plant trees. The tree planting site will be in Coquitlam. We will invite some members (there will be a limit) to the tree planting. We will also provide a reception to wrap up celebrating our 100th anniversary. If we are able to reconvene soon for in-person meetings, the BC/Yukon Regional Executive will look for many opportunities for us to reconnect respecting the fact that a lot of us like the virtual approach and we will try to build that in where we can. We are a big family and we would like to get back together and will be looking at opportunities to reconnect.

Robert thanked the regional office staff again for all their support. Thank you to Kris Hawkins and Shira Gordon for being here today. Thank you to the Chair Dan Jones for doing such a wonderful job as usual. Thank you to Philip Mantler our Parliamentarian. Thank you to the national office IT staff Jason Duguay and Dave Meyers and the Regional Executive as well. Thank you to the delegates who showed up today and helping us make sure the business of the Institute keeps moving. Please get the message out about how important it is to get our members involved in the union. We need to be more forceful in having our members get more involved.
