
# **Discord Server Starter Kit**

## What This Is

A beginner-friendly guide to setting up a Discord server for your club, team, or gaming community. Whether you're running a high school program, local esports org, or just starting out, this will give you a solid foundational structure to grow from out of the box.

## **Server Setup Checklist**

Before you invite people, make sure the basics are in place:

- Create a clear server name + icon image (we recommend Canva, it's free!)
- Write out copy for a short Welcome Message that will live in your #welcome channel
- Draft your community Rules and prepare to pin the message in a #rules channel
- Set up Roles (e.g. Admin, Player, Coach, Member, etc.)
- Add key Channels (see below)
- Install essential bots (see below) to automate certain processes/features
- Invite others part of your community to help you finalize setup

**Pro Tip:** we recommend also creating a few private channels that only you and trusted members of your staff have access to. You can use these channels for internal communications and for setting up bots, third party integrations, and more!

## **Mod Roles & Permissions Template**

#### **Roles to Create:**

- X Admin (full access)
- Moderator (can kick/mute, manage channels)

**Pro Tip**: Use **role color coding** and **category permissions** to keep things clean and manageable. The above role matrix is just a general rule of thumb hierarchy when it comes to dividing access and permissions.

### **Recommended Bots**

Bot	Purpose
Carl-bot	Role management, logging, automod
<u>Dyno</u>	Moderation, announcements
MEE6	Leveling system, reaction roles
Statbot	Server analytics

### **Best Practices for Growth**

- Have a clean onboarding process with clear rules, community overview, and roles for people to select
- Be active, welcoming and engaging with all new users in your server
- Use Discord Events feature to schedule games/hangouts
- Ask open-ended questions in general chat to spark discussion
- Run simple competitions or polls to drive engagement (e.g. "would you join us for a movie night?")
- Share the invite link across all your marketing outlets (e.g. social media, websites, etc.)
