More information about course registration for the 2022-2023 school year will be coming over the next 2-3 weeks.

PSAT & SAT Testing

Students in grades 9 & 10 will take the PSAT this spring and students in grade 11 will take the SAT. These assessments are part of the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) assessments this spring. The primary test date for the PSAT/SAT is Wednesday April 13, 2022. Please look for an email early next week with some important details that include:

- Information about the optional essay for 11th grade students completing the SAT, and how you can opt-in to taking the essay on test day.
- Information about the Student Data Questionnaire (SDQ) that is an optional component of the assessment process for students in grades 10 and 11. Completion of this optional survey requires parental consent, so information about the SDQ and how to consent to or decline the SDQ will be included.
- Information about testing with accommodations. These accommodations are typically included in a 504, IEP, or ELD plan, and parental consent is required to be able to disclose information to the CollegeBoard to request appropriate accommodations.

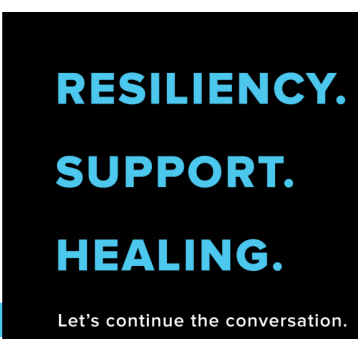
