Answer the following questions honestly, truthfully, and completely. **Read this entire page before you answer yes or no below.** If you have not read or read completely the majority (Books 1-4) of *The Once and Future King*, there will be no extra penalty beyond missing this test. See the instructions at the end of this test.

1. Have you **read completely** (not skimmed) **the majority** (through and including at least all of book three) of the assigned novel, *The Once and Future King*?

If you answered **YES** to the above question, get Test 2 from Mr. Scotese's desk. Test 2 is a multiple choice test that is very specific including quotes and material not found in study guides and other ancillary material but that should be obvious to those who have read the book. Those that do poorly on Test 2 and answered YES above will need to speak with Mr. Scotese about this discrepancy. See below.

If you answered **NO** to the above question, get out your book and start doing a thorough reading (and good for you for your honesty). You will have 2 weeks (the test will be Tuesday, January 20 (after the Holiday) – after Finals that day) to complete the novel at which time you will be allowed to take a very rigorous test on it (and you will be asked to show me either notes or your marked up book) – you will be able to receive 70% credit on this makeup test. You will also be allowed to make up the group works (worth 200 points) **with absolutely no penalty (on the group works)**. You are of course eligible for all extra credit (there is more than enough Shakespeare extra credit to make up for your 50% test score).

If you answered **YES** to the above question and it is later determined (after our conference) that **you did NOT do the reading** – you will **NOT** be eligible for the following.

- A makeup test (see above) – you will receive a 0 for the 800 points.
- The group work for this novel – 200 points
- **Any extra credit for this and next quarter in any form**
- You will **not be eligible** to be signed out of my class for the rest of the semester.

DO NOT WORRY ABOUT HAVING READ AND GETTING THE ANSWERS WRONG: I KNOW HOW EACH OF YOU DO – WHEN YOU DO THE READING.

Additionally, each test (given to different periods) has different questions and each year new questions are added – if anyone taking the test gets more older questions right, or more questions that were given in an earlier period right, than they get other sets of questions correct – they will also be asked to explain those results. **DO NOT SHARE** questions with other periods – it can only hurt them (not to mention any curve given). If they ask tell them there are too many questions to keep them straight (there are – over 50!)

Finally, do the right thing, because it is the right thing – not because of penalties & rewards. Thank you for your honesty.
