ABSTRACT (Times New Roman 11)

The abstract comes after the title page in the manuscript. Abstract must be integrated and independent which is consist of **background, purpose, methods, results, conclusion, and suggestions**. However, the abstract should be written as a single paragraph without these headers. For this reason, references should be avoided. Also, non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided, but if essential, they must be defined at their first mention in the abstract itself. Abstract must be written using **200 to 250 words**, which has no references and is accompanied by keywords.


