Part 1: Read and <u>annotate</u> Part One (through p. 128) of Tobias Wolff's memoir *In Pharaoh's Army: Memories of the Lost War.* I will check your annotations on the first day of school in August. **Warning: Race is a key theme in parts of this book. You should be prepared to encounter some offensive language and to treat the discussion of this issue with maturity and respect.**

- 3. Why is Wolff said to have "command presence?" What does he lose in order to gain this?
- 4. How does Wolff's experience as a white soldier in Vietnam force him to empathize with black people in America?
