***Please read this following:***

The BOEE and our approved licensure program with the Iowa Department of Education requires that student teachers “teach for a minimum of 15 weeks in order to be recommended for licensure.” A student teacher might miss a day or two due to illness.

Missing three (or more) days in a row is considered a break other than the school’s official calendar and would create a situation in which a student teacher was not meeting minimum BOEE and licensure requirements. Therefore, said student teacher could

not be recommended for licensure. We understand that there may be school sponsored athletic/activity needs that for *normal classes* would be “excused” (granted all work was made-up in an appropriate manner). However, student teaching is crafted in structure to meet state *licensure* requirements (not just college requirements). You will not be allowed to miss days due to an athletic event or other activity during your weeks of student teaching. If one is in a sport that will require absences, one will need to begin planning early in their time at Simpson College so that they will be able to student teach during a non-sport/activity engaged semester.
