# **Preliminary Findings**

- Sports, Cooking, and Art are of the highest interest to students.
- **Tutoring** is of very high importance to staff and parents and of interest to about one-fifth of responding students.
- There are many activities of interest to sizable groups of students. An additional student survey may be of use to prioritize offerings.

### **Preliminary Findings**

- After-school activities are of interest to more than half of staff and parents/caregivers, and close to half of students.
- Academic support for students is of very high interest to staff and high interest to parents. 42% of students recognize a need for help with homework and organizing their schoolwork, and 28% believe tutoring would help them succeed in school.
- Fun family activities are of high interest to staff and parents/caregivers.
- For many supports, staff estimation of need is higher than as rated by parents/caregivers. Learning more about observed needs from both staff and parents/caregivers would be useful.

#### **Preliminary Findings**

- Parents: Large majorities of parents expressed strong satisfaction with the school in all areas. Receiving communication in preferred languages is very high, with 95% responding agree or strongly agree. 83% agreed or strongly agreed that there is a staff person they trust and can talk with openly. 83% agreed or strongly agreed that they get the help they need for their children to succeed in school. Three-quarters of responding parents agree or strongly agree that the after-school activities are of interest to their children. Most parents agreed or strongly agreed that the school leaders listen to parents (81%) and students (78%) to inform decisions and planning. 77% agreed or strongly agreed that there are activities and ways for parents to be involved at school of interest to them.
- Students: Large majorities of students responded agree or strongly agree that they get the help they need to succeed in school (74%) and know who to ask when they need help (80%). 66% agreed or strongly agreed that the school leaders listen to and respect

students' ideas and opinions. A little more than half agreed or strongly agreed that after-school activities are interesting to them and help them learn.

• Staff: 77% agreed or strongly agreed that school leaders listen to and learn from staff to inform planning and decisions. 67% agreed or strongly agreed that parents have a staff person they trust and can talk with openly; a lower estimation than the 83% of parents who agreed or strongly agreed with this statement for themselves. 64% agreed or strongly agreed that parents get the information and support to help students with schoolwork at home, with an additional 28% responding somewhat agreed.
