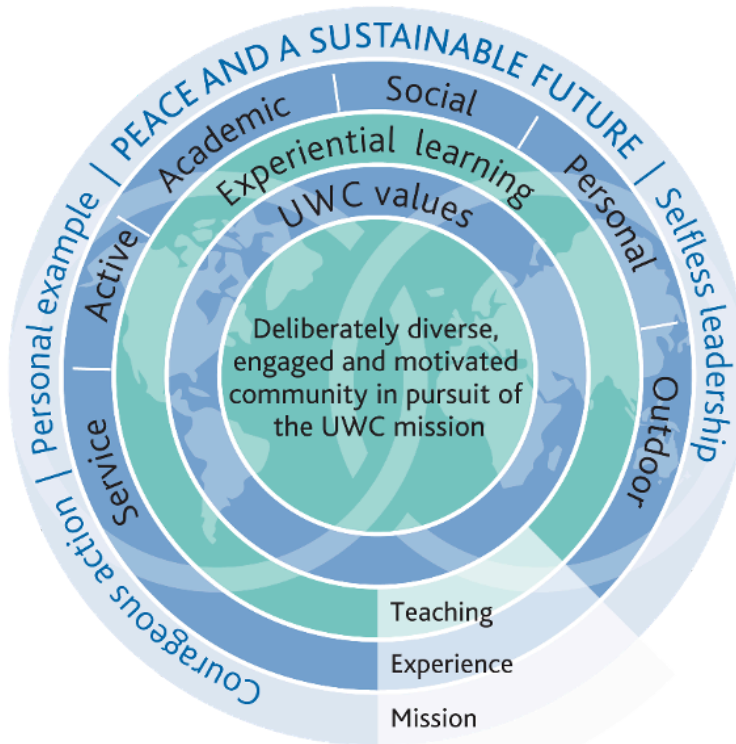

1. About United World Colleges (UWC):

UWC was founded in 1962 with the vision of bringing together young people, whose experience was of the political conflict of the cold war era, offering an educational experience based on shared learning, collaboration and understanding where students would act as champions of peace. More than fifty years from its beginning, the organization remains committed to taking its mission of making education a uniting force further by expanding its reach to embrace the tensions and conflicts that exist within as well as between societies

UWC schools, colleges and programmes deliver a challenging and transformative education experience to a diverse cross section of students, inspiring them to create a more peaceful and sustainable future.

UWC has 18 schools and colleges across 5 continents all with distinctive characters but sharing the same mission, ethos and values.



All UWC schools are co-educational, residential educational facilities and follow the same curriculum leading up to the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma, which is a worldwide recognized upper secondary school curriculum equivalent to the GCSE A levels. Although strong

academic achievement is valued highly at UWC, academic achievements are put into perspective with a demanding mix of community engagement, international affairs, physical activities and creative pursuits.

UWC's student intake is deliberately diverse and each of the schools and colleges draws together students from many different nations and backgrounds. Our bursaries, scholarships and fee structures aim to ensure a broad socio-economic mix within the student body that adds value to the student experience and the organisation.

UWC depends on the dedication and expertise of a network of volunteers to promote UWC and select future students. These are called national committees and they operate in more than 145 countries worldwide. The UWC National Committee for the Maldives is located in Male', Maldives, and is run by alumni from Maldives with the support of Alifulhu Thuthu Foundation. Each year the national committee receives from the UWC schools and colleges a specific number of places (which may include a scholarship, bursary/partial scholarship or fee-paying place) for which they select students to study the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma.

The UWC selection process in ***the Maldives UWC National Committee***

2. Eligibility criteria:

To be eligible to apply you must meet the following criteria:

- *Must be a Maldivian citizen*
- *Must be between the ages of 15-17 on August 01, 2026*
- *For applicants currently in grade 10: must have acquired an overall final grade of "C" (or number grade equivalent) or above in all subjects (O'Level track), in Grades 8 and 9, and the first term of Grade 10*
- *For applicants who have graduated from grade 10: must have acquired an overall final grade of "C" or above in all subjects (O'level track) in Grades 8, 9, 10, as well as in O'Level examinations.*
- *Must be prepared for a two-year absence from home and be fully committed to the ideals of the United World Colleges*

Note: We welcome all students that meet the above criteria to submit an application. Students with physical, learning and/or mental disabilities are encouraged to apply.

Social Competence: Have the desire to interact respectfully with others, the ability to express oneself adequately among diverse opinions and people.
