

SECOND LESSON Ephesians 1:11-23 THE HOLY GOSPEL

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. The candidates who are unable to speak for themselves are presented by their parents and godparents saying I present Jasper to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When all have been presented the Presider asks the parents and godparents the following

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life.

Answer We will, with God's help.

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Answer We will, with God's help.

Then the Presider asks the following questions of candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the child

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual

forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Presider May God be with you.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The Presider touches the water saying

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

Each candidate is presented by name to the Presider, or to an assisting priest or deacon, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying

Jasper, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Presider places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross

Jasper, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

The Presider then says

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

PRESENTATION OF BAPTISMAL SYMBOLS

The Presider says

Jasper, you have become a new Creation and have clothed yourself in Christ.

See in your baptismal stole the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends and this Christian community to help you by word and example, may you fulfill the ministry Christ has entrusted to you.

See in your baptismal candle the light of Christ. May it always be a reminder to you that you have passed from darkness to light. Shine as Christ's light in the world to the glory of God, your Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer.

When all have been baptized, the Presider says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Presider continues

Communion is offered with bread (which is gluten free) and wine, (and, at the West Transept, both grape juice and wine). Please take communion by eating the bread and sipping from the cup. It will help the communion minister if you guide the cup to your mouth. If you do not feel able to sip from the cup, please allow it to pass by. We believe that, if you have received communion with only bread, you have received full communion. Cross your arms over your heart if you wish to receive a blessing in place of consuming. Let an usher know if you need to receive at your pew.
