Your challenge: Create a short (less than 3 mins) video explaining something you learned in mathematics this year.

Be creative, be clear, use great math vocabulary and your video might be included on the Ramapo Central website!

Be sure to get your parents' permission to participate in this project.

Before making the video you'll want to plan out your idea. Here are some thoughts to get you started:

- What mathematics topic or problem do you want to demonstrate?
- What are the important steps, ideas, and math vocabulary you'll want to point out?
- Practice explaining it as if you were explaining it to a student a year younger than you.
- Have an adult or older student check to make sure you did the problem correctly.
- How can you make your video interesting and engaging for people watching it?

You can use the video feature on a camera or phone. Or try one of these apps or websites: Educreations, ShowMe, Lensoo (for Android), Movenote. If you find another great app to use, please let us know!

Once you've created your video and you're ready to submit it, please complete this Google form (currently under construction, available by July 15):

The form will ask you to submit a URL where the video can be found. Many of these apps allow you to share your video, or you can put it on YouTube. If you'd like, it can be [unlisted](#) on YouTube.
