Local Non-profits

Culture Aid NOLA

 Local nonprofit serving food to the community since 2020. Partnering with larger orgs in this post-Ida time to feed the community, including free grocery giveaways at large outdoor venues.

Feed the Second Line

 An org working to feed and help the culture bearers of NOLA. After Ida, they've been helping patch roofs, feed the community and much more. Direct impact for folks in the city. (They also have a solar powered project to help restaurants survive power outages as happened with Ida.)
