Title: When Grandpa Gives You A Toolbox

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Grade Levels: TK/K

Global Competence: Keep an open mind



Book Summary: A boy is disappointed with his grandfather's gift. Until he learns he can use it to build exactly what he wanted with his own two hands, and a little help from his grandpa.

How to Read With Your Student:

Step 1: Picture Walk. Flip through the book one page at a time, without reading the words, just looking at the pictures. This step can be done together or by the student independently.

Step 2: First Read. Now, go back through the book and read the words that are written on each page. During this step, please model good reading skills (flipping pages gently, tracking the words with your finger as you read, etc.) If your student is able to read any of the words independently, please allow and encourage them to do so. If there is not an adult who can read the words to your student, a read aloud of the book can be found by searching the title on Youtube.

Step 3: Discuss. Flip back through the book one more time and ask your student questions while you re-read. Some question examples are: What do you notice? How does this make you feel? Have you ever experienced this? Would you be interested in trying this (food, clothing, game, etc.)?

Directions:

1. Read the book - following the "How to Read With Your Student" steps from above
2. Discuss - Prompt your student with the following sentence starters:
 - "I think..."
 - "I wonder..."
 - "I notice..."
 - "This reminds me of..."

3. Add an entry to the book journal. Answer the following questions.

1. If you were given a toolbox what would you build? Please draw and write a description of it.
2. If you have ever built something with your grandpa can you tell us about it? Please draw and write a description of it.
