1. a) The features of the Canaanite religion.

- i. It was based on nature / cosmic / cyclic.
- ii. It was polytheistic / comprised of many gods and goddesses.
- iii. Symbols / idols / images were made to represent each god.
- iv. Temple prostitution was part of the worship of gods.
- v. Both human and animals / sacrifices were made to the gods.
- vi. Festivals and feasts were celebrated in honour of the gods.
- vii. Rituals were performed to ensure continued fertility and well being of the community.
- viii. There were prophets and prophetesses for each god and goddess.
- ix. Each god / goddess played a specific role in the community.
- x. There was a chief god / goddess.
- xi. Had temples and shrines / high places of worship.

(Any 8 × 1 = 8marks)

b) Seven ways in which King Jeroboam promoted the spread of Idolatry in Israel.

- i. He made two golden calves and placed one at Bethel and another at Dan to represent Yahweh.
- ii. He set up two rival places of worship at Dan and Bethel and ignored Jerusalem.
- iii. He made the Israelites to offer sacrifices to the golden calves.
- iv. He chose priests from ordinary families to serve at worship centres.
- v. He built other places of worship / shrines on hill tops.
- vi. He burnt incense on altars of the idols / made sacrifices to idols.
- vii. He instituted religious festivals in the months of his choice.

c) Reasons that makes Christians to enter into Idolatry today.

- i. Lack of faith in God.
- ii. Poverty / unemployment.
- iii. Marital problems / domestic violence.
- iv. Negative peer pressure.
- v. Desire for fame / prestige.
- vi. Frustrations from unanswered prayers.
- vii. A lot of wealth.
- viii. Ill health / sickness / misfortunes.
- ix. Permissiveness in the society.

2. a) Teachings of Jesus on sin. (7marks)

- i. Jesus has power to forgive sins.
- ii. God forgives peoples sins on condition that they also forgive others.
- iii. We should ask god to forgive our sins.
- iv. We should ask god to protect us against sin.
- v. Nothing is covered that shall not be revealed / sins will be exposed.
- vi. Sins come from the heart.
- vii. Sin is not only the act but evil thought also.
- viii. We should forgive each other.
- ix. Those who lead others to sin will be severely punished.

- x. Forgiveness of sin should be limitless.
- xi. Sins that are forgiven on earth are also forgiven in heaven.
- xii. Sin leads to death / punishment / loss of god's kingdom / separation from god.
- xiii. All other sins are forgivable by god except the sin of blasphemy.
- xiv. Sin should be condemned / rebuked. **(First 7 × 1 = 7marks)**

b) Reasons why Jesus used the parable of the lost son in His teachings.

- i. To encourage sinners to accept the word of God.
- ii. To show the consequences of loose living.
- iii. To encourage people to realize their sinfulness / be willing to repent / reconcile.
- iv. To teach about God's love for all people / kingdom of God is for all people.
- v. To show God's unconditional forgiveness.
- vi. To warn against judging others / condemning others.
- vii. To teach his audience the need to rejoice for / welcome repentant sinners.
- viii. He warned to encourage families to live in harmony / unity. **(Any 7 × 1 = 7marks)**

c) Why Christians should practice forgiveness.

- i. It shows love for others.
- ii. It creates / promotes peace.
- iii. It is a way of winning converts.
- iv. It shows obedience to Christians teaching / commands.
- v. In order to follow the example of Christ.
- vi. In order to be forgiven by god.
- vii. It strengthen relationship / tolerance.
- viii. It lengthens life / promotes healthy living.

- He commanded his son Solomon to be obedient and follow God's ways
- He sacrificed to God after he brought the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem.
- He made a covenant with the elders to be their leaders.

- People will thirst/ hunger for the word of God
- It will be a day of disappointment and defeat to the Israelites
- The wicked will not escape God's judgment

- He rich took [poor people 's garments in pledge
- The poor were robbed of their food/ grains/ belongings

- Merchants overcharged the poor when selling them anything
- The poor were sold for a piece of silver / pair of shoes as they were considered useless.
- The goods sold to the poor were unfit for human use consumption / expired
- They were unable to pay their debts to the rich
- The poor were denied justice in the law courts because they could not bribe the judges.
- The cases taken to the courts by the poor were thrown out not listened to

- VIII. He would call people to repentance
- IX. Many Israel would turn to God through him
- X. He would turn the fathers' hearts to their children.

(b) Describe the incident when Jesus accompanied his parents for the Passover festival at the age of 12 years in Luke 2:41-52 (8mks)

Jesus and his parents went for the Passover feast in Jerusalem
After the feast was over the parents started on their journey Home

After a day's journey they looked for Him among relatives and friends but did not find Him
They returned to Jerusalem to look for Him Jesus was found in the temple after a three days search.

The parents found Him seated among the teachers of the law. Jesus was listening and asking them questions. Those who heard Him were amazed by His level of understanding and the answers He gave His parents were astonished and asked Him why He had treated them like that

Jesus asked them why they were looking for Him when He had to be in His father's house.

The parents did not understand Him
Jesus obeyed and went back with them (8mks)

- i. Jesus was from Nazareth
- ii. Jesus had human nature
- iii. He had a divine nature /son of God
- iv. He was attested by God in working miracles/signs/wonders
- v. His crucifixion and death was according to God's plan
- vi. God raised him from dead/he overcome death
- vii. His death and resurrection fulfilled the prophecy
- viii. He is a descendent of David. 6x1=6mks

(b) Describe Paul's teaching on unity of Christians using the analogy of the vine and branches (7mks)

- I. God is the vine dresser! Jesus is the vine
- II. The follower of Christ / Christians are the branches
- III. The unfaithful Christians are the unfruitful branches which are cut away /destroyed
- IV. Christians are related to God through Jesus Christ
- V. The faithful Christians /fruitful branches are pruned so as to produce more fruit
- VI. For Christians to continue bearing fruits/ doing good they must remain united to Christ
- VII. Through Jesus Christ all Christians are joined to one another
- VIII. Christians should rely on God for all providence
- IX. Love is passed on to Christians from God through Jesus

X. Christians should keep/observe God's commandments (7x1=7mks)

(c) **State seven ways of promoting unity of believers in the Christian community (7mks)**

- I. Preaching love and forgiveness to one another
- II. Organizing inter-denominational prayers
- III. Reconciling warring parties / encouraging peace agreements
- IV. Forming ecumenical movements / groupings of different churches

- VI. Encouraging /promoting dialogue among people in the society
- VII. Condemning customs and practices which threatened unity in the society
