-Acadience reading k-3 87% of students will be on or above grade level with end of year acadience.

-Tiered small group time daily

-Use of Rigby Readers and 95 percent for intervention groups

-Share resources and instruction for incoming kindergarten students.

-Use take home kits for k & 1 with games and resources and share the family newsletters.

-Regular progress monitoring.

Share more information with parents on how to support students who are receiving the letter notifying them they are not on grade level.
