geography	the study of earth, its features, and the distribution of life on the planet.
map	<ul> <li>a picture or chart that shows the different parts of something</li> <li>A map is a representation, usually on a flat surface, of the features of an area of the earth or a portion of the heavens, usually to scale.</li> </ul>
location	a place or position
exact location	the latitude and longitude of a specific place
relative location	<ul> <li>the location of a place in relation to another. For example, Vermont is north of Massachusetts</li> </ul>
place	<ul> <li>the physical (mountains, lakes, streams, deserts, forests, etc.) features and human (buildings, roads, bridges, mines, etc.)that make a place unique.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Example: Vermont is a unique place due to its many mountains, rivers, old farms, and history.</li> </ul>
movement	travel from place to place and the exchange of goods and ideas.
	<ul> <li>Example: Traders traveling throughout the Mediterranean sea exchanged goods, ideas, and news about different regions.</li> </ul>
region	<ul> <li>areas that are united by similar physical conditions or by common cultural traits.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Example: New England is a region known for its dense forests and rocky ocean coastline.</li> </ul>
	the interaction between people and their environment.
interaction	<ul> <li>Example: Throughout history, humans have adapted to and changed their natural environment.</li> </ul>
principle	a rule to live by
value	<ul> <li>a person's principles or standards of behavior; one's judgment of what is important in life</li> </ul>
relationship	the way in which two or more concepts, objects, or people are connected, or the state of being connected
peninsula	<ul> <li>a piece of land almost surrounded by water or projecting out into a body of water.</li> </ul>

plateau	an area of relatively level high ground
mountain	<ul> <li>a large natural elevation of the earth's surface rising abruptly from the surrounding level; a large steep hill</li> </ul>
infrastructure	<ul> <li>the basic physical and organizational structures and facilities (e.g., buildings, roads, and power supplies) needed for the operation of a society</li> </ul>
