BOT MAKING ESSENTIALS

-NOTES-

There is no right nor wrong way to make a bot, a bot with 400–750 *permanent* tokens can be just as good as a bot with 2.5k *permanent* tokens (yet, you should probably have less than 1k-2k *permanent* tokens, going more will result in the bot remembering less of it, total tokens can be whatever number).

One thing I see that happens not so often—mainly on people’s first bots—is in the Personality section; people’ll just add personality, like just adjectives, nothing else. Yet, the Personality section is more of a description section. Some main additions you need in the Personality section are: Gender, Personality, Appearance, Speech, Clothing, Occupation, Backstory/Origin, Relationships, Age, and blah blah blah. These main things will keep the role-play forward, just in case you’re like me and don’t like to end chats. Other and less needed additions you can add are: Likes, Dislikes, Kinks, Sexual Mannerisms / Intimacy, Sexuality, Species, etc.

For my format, I use the JED format; I also put the name of the character you’re creating when talking about them in the Backstory/Origin section instead of {{char}}. I do this because unlike other apps (ex. c.ai, chai, charstar, etc.) that auto put {{char}} as the character, Janitor doesn’t right now—yet I believe they’re (moderators) fixing it. Even if it is fixed, adding it just in case will help since JLLM is known to be... interestingly forgetful.

Another thing I see often is people using the Example Dialogs section oddly. Like, instead of the recommended practice example:

Instead, they use:

I don’t know why they do this, yet I feel like the best way to use Example Dialogs is:

```

In addition, I also see people not adding anything in the Scenario section; like, I’d get if there is no scenario, like an RPG. Yet most of the time, I do see a scenario in the initial message without adding anything in the Scenario section.

Next, is the Initial message. One thing that I see wrong is people using 2nd person pronouns for {{user}}; which makes {{char}} more likely to talk for {{user}}. Instead of 2nd person pronouns, I use 3rd (they/them, she/her, he/him and so on). One thing I see a lot in c.ai and sometimes in janitor is people using: *narration* whatever {{char}} says *narration*. Which yes, does work, but I feel like you should add quotation marks when {{char}} is talking. Similar to this, I see {{user}} being spoken for in the Initial message, which makes me and probably others click

off the bot and not use it. That's all I have to say, so we'll move onto the actual format (of course, you can edit the format when making your bot; it's your bot, not mine).

-GOING INTO DETAIL-

Most things in the JED format can be fiddled around with. You can change and add things as much as you please. Like how you can always add/subtract new sections (# EXAMPLE) and add/subtract bullet points (- EXAMPLE:).

Some other things about just making a bot in general is where to find sources for stuff like names—as in specific kind of name—and what nationalities/ethnicities there are (I can only remember around ten, don't worry my love). Along with words for descriptions for the initial message.
