According to the Arkansas Ready for Learning Model released by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), each school is required to have a Learning Management System (LMS). A Learning Management System hosts and tracks online learning. It is a virtual hub that allows you to manage content, record and measure learning, store learner data, and communicate with (and enable communication amongst) students and families.

We are asking you to become familiar with your grade level LMS.
