## **Learning Targets for the Day:**

- Students will learn about Shayne Greco's artwork and how it relates to ocean conservation.
- Students will learn about texture in artwork and how it adds to a piece.
- Students will continue creating their fish out of clay and will begin to add texture and details.
   Afterwards the pieces will dry and then be fired in the kiln.



- Conservation: prevention of wasteful use of a resource.
- Texture: is the perceived surface quality of a work of art. The feel or look of a work, such as a design or pattern.
- Fired: The process of bringing clay up to a high temperature and curing it in place.
- Kiln: a heated enclosure for firing clay.

- Artwork: How would you describe the texture in his pieces?
- World: How can the world participate in ocean conservation?
- **Audience:** Who is the audience for Shayne Greco's work?
