Sderot receives nonstop rockets and has less than 15 seconds to run to shelter.

The IDF has instructed people to evacuate because it's become too dangerous. Many people did manage to evacuate. Several took hits on their way out—one family got onto the highway only to hear a siren and watched a rocket blow their car up. They then had to hitchhike with nothing but the clothes on their backs.

But thousands of people are left behind, too afraid to risk the step out of their bomb shelters. These are mostly the elderly and parents with small children.

There are no stores open in Sderot. Nothing since before Simchat Torah, almost 11 days ago. Even if there were, the streets are empty. No one dares leave their house.

Except for Rabbi Asher Pizem and his volunteers. Yesterday, they arrived at the home of an elderly couple and found their house empty. Not a morsel of food anywhere. The couple were sitting in their bomb shelter, trembling and crying in relief, when he came to refill their pantry.

The Chabad House was turned into a warehouse, which they call "the free supermarket." People in Sderot call the rabbi, and he delivers. Free of charge. Not free of risk to his life.



## **Battalion**

The Battalion, numbered 8208, we are supporting is responsible for guarding the Kibbutzim, small villages in Israel, and keeping them safe from more invasions; they are currently in Bahad 1, the military base right by Gaza.
