- I. What is the Environment
- a. Not 'school'
- b. Not 'work'

Is it warm? Welcoming? Not boring?

Balance of head & heart. Content & Community.

Goals & objectives sound like school – we want people to absorb the love of God.

Head & Heart, Is it transformational?

- II. Transformational –
- a. Share an activity of church outside of Sunday when you were inspired or transformed.

i. Living in a place where we were the minority, had to

live our faith.

ii. Church gave up a close family time to minister to

others – church was changed.

- iii. The impact of simple gifts
- b. Share a learning experience in your faith life that has changed you.
 - i. Major life event, facing mortality, God gave me life.
 - ii. Hitting despair, but then saw the power of prayer.
 - iii. Cumulative changes

The church becomes witness to these transformational events – we have to be open to others in the midst of these events.

Walking beside each other.

Gathering together to share stories.

Getting out, together, out of our box and making changes in our community.

Connecting with others.
