
- 76% of students attended a CTE course in the Fall of 2018


CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION ENROLLMENT

CURRICULUM

Instructional Coach

In 2017-2018, a full-time Instructional Coach, Rick Bough, was added to the CTE Staff. Budgets

CTE teachers were asked if their current budget meets their supply and equipment needs. 41 out of 51 that answered the survey said yes.

These were the comments from the teachers indicating the reasons they need more budget money next year so we can adjust as needed/if possible.

- I need a lab instead of just a classroom for PLTW labs.
- Architectural Design 2 designed a basic stud wall frame with window and door openings that would fit
 inside my classroom. Interior Design 2 were going to do faux finishes on the walls of the staff
 bathrooms. They practiced with ceiling tiles. The money I was planning on using for these was used by
 another teacher. (\$500)
- greenhouse, soil and plants, egg incubator, classroom sets of markers/pencils/paper,
- I need a larger for architecture due to the supplies for model making, etc. tends to add up.
- I would love to have the ACT Curriculum for my students! Lehman uses it and it is very useful.
- It does cover much of what we need for day to day supplies and equipment. It does not accommodate for the needed equipment required for our plant science pathway which is part of the ag budget. iegreenhouse or replacing our broken floral coolers for floral design (5 sections of floral design)
- Laser printer broken and no money left in my budget to replace it
- My Graphic Design students are pretty set up. I would like to buy 'accurip' software to separate colors for screen printing. My commercial photo classes were lacking in supplies. Most of the cameras and lenses that were to be used for this course are not working. We only had about 5 cameras to share amongst 20 students per class. (x 2 classes). The classroom space/setup is not sufficient for the courses I teach as well. There is nowhere to set up a 'photography studio' or lock up equipment. The screen printing equipment is not being used to its potential as it causes toxic fumes when printing more than a dozen shirts, there is no running water, and it takes up an incredible amount of space.
- This is a hard question to answer. Yes, we have enough to meet small supply needs in class, but no we do not have enough to also meet equipment needs for my subject. The plant science pathway is brand new and our budget has not been able to supply a lab space such as a greenhouse or a new walk in cooler as the one at LHS has been broken all year. We have one small cooler but it does not fit the

supplies that are needed for over 130 floral students, another walk-in cooler will eventually be needed. Access to water is lacking and to teach any of the plant sciences water access is needed inside, and outside. Curriculum for turfgrass management does not exist in our district and landscape design is of the lowest quality available, budget money did not allow for these funds as well as textbook adoption rules.

- HBS and MI labs are almost all kits and can be expensive.
- With the addition of Floral Design to our budget we did not have as much money to go around to all 3 teachers that share out of this budget. Rolling whiteboard, access to technology, construction materials for Principles of Ag classes.

Middle School CTE Courses

The legislature recently approved CTE weighted funding for 7th and 8th grade. Gateway To Technology, GTT, has approximately 800 students enrolled in 2019-2020 and will begin receiving the weighted funding. We hope to expand more of our current high school pathways to the middle schools in 2020-2021.

Programs of Study

The Texas Education Agency has recently released Programs of Study for public comment to be implemented in 2020-2021. With the implementation of the new Programs of Study along with expanding into the middle schools, we will be looking at adjusting our current pathway offerings in the spring of 2020.

Areas of Personal/Department Improvement

New Facilities

Much time was spent in 2018-2019 designing buildings, participating in construction meetings and ordering equipment. The new CTE facilities will be opening in 2019-2020 at all three high school campuses.

- Johnson HS will be a comprehensive high school which will include all of our CTE pathways and will
 open in August.
- Hays HS is in the process of remodeling the old band hall and is expected to be open in October. It
 will include broadcasting, culinary arts and vet tech.
- Lehman HS is building a new facilty which will include auto tech and vet tech and will be ready in September. We are also remodeling a current classroom to house broadcasting.

Goals for Future Growth

- Build Greenhouses for Hays HS and Lehman HS to be used by Ag Science and Culinary Arts
- Consideration of district centralized Career and Technical Education Center which would eliminate building more duplicated labs and shops. Some possible programs that could be considered are:
 - o Ag Barn We do not currently have an ag barn.
 - o Auto Body We do not currently offer auto body.
 - o Auto Tech Will be at all three high schools but very expensive to keep replicating.
 - o Bank A+ Federal Credit Union partners with many districts in the area. The bank is located within the school is an excellent intership site for our business and finance students.
 - o Barbering We do not currently offer barbering but plan to add it in the future.
 - o Broadcasting Will be at all three high schools but very expensive to keep replicating.
 - Cosmetology Will be at all three high schools but very expensive to keep replicating.
 - o Courtroom We do not currently have a courtroom for the law enforcement classes.
 - o Culinary Arts Will be at all three high schools but very expensive to keep replicating.
 - o CyberSecurity We do not currently offer CyberSecurity but plan to add it in the future.

- o Dental Assistant
- o Electrical We currently offer construction classes but would like to have the facilities to offer specialized programs.
- o EMT The students currently meet at the Kyle Fire Department.
- o Engineering We currently have at all three high schools.
- o Firefighter Academy The students currently meet at the Kyle Fire Department.
- o HVAC We currently offer construction classes but would like to have the facilities to offer specialized programs.
- o Masonry We currently offer construction classes but would like to have the facilities to offer specialized programs.
- o Meats Lab We do not currently have a meats lab.
- o Plumbing We currently offer construction classes but would like to have the facilities to offer specialized programs.
- o Real Estate We do not currently offer real estate but plan to add it in the future.
