INTRODUCTION (sub-heading, Cambria 12, Capital)

Explaining the background to the article, its aims, a summary of a search of the existing literature and the issue under discussion. The explanation is described in a clear and adequate narrative format and does not use sub-chapters. Include references (relevant literature or research results) used in each sentence as specified in the reference. (Cambria 11, Space: 1,15)

MAIN TEXT (sub-heading, Cambria 12, Capital)

Contains the body of the article, and may also be broken into subsections with short, informative headings. The discussion is not a rewriting of the research results, but rather contains a brief summary of the core / key research results, supporting arguments, discussion of other relevant published research results and the contribution of findings to the enrichment and development of science and technology for society. The discussion section may consist of several sub-chapters.

Tables may be prepared in Microsoft Word or Microsoft Excel and must be embedded in the word-processing file. Authors are asked to follow these guidelines: (1) Number tables consecutively using Arabic numerals. (2) Include a descriptive heading that explains the table. (3) Give footnotes a letter designation, and cite in the table by italic superscript letters, labelling sequentially by lines of the table.

The preferred submission procedure is to embed graphic files in the word-processing document near the point where they should appear in the final publication. Separate graphic files may also be included with the submission package. The document settings should be in RGB mode. (Cambria 11, Space: 1,15)

CONCLUSION (sub-heading, Cambria 12, Capital)

Clearly states the main conclusions and include an explanation of their relevance or importance to the field. The conclusion section must explain the main conclusions of the article, answer the problem and research objectives, highlight its essence and relevance and provide suggestions or recommendations for further or other research. (Cambria 11, Space: 1,15)

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS (sub-heading, Cambria 12, Capital) - Optional

(Can be written if needed) In this section a form of thanks can be written to the research contributors without writing a title. (Cambria 11, Space: 1,15)

REFERENCES (follow the APA 7th style using Mendeley Reference Manager)

Text: Citations in the text should follow the referencing style used by the American Psychological Association. You are referred to the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Seventh Edition, ISBN 978-1-4338-3215-4, copies of which may be [ordered online](#).

List: References should be arranged first alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically if necessary. More than one reference from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the letters 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., placed after the year of publication.
