# **Meeting Notes**

#### Council Vote: Consent Agenda and Member Updates

- 1. Consent Agenda: approve <u>January 2025 meeting notes</u>
  - Motion to approve consent agenda made by Noelle Hause, seconded by Shannon Bekman.
  - o Motion passes by unanimous consent.

#### **Public Updates**

- 1. Tricia Pai-Bonman, Director of Strategic Initiatives at Early Milestones Colorado:
  - a. Tricia Bonman announced the release of a new report developed by Early Milestones Colorado, that examines changes in the <u>Infant and</u> <u>Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH) landscape in Colorado over the</u> <u>past decade.</u> The report includes a legislative timeline highlighting key laws and policy developments that have shaped the IECMH system in the state.



#### Strategic Plan, 2025 Actions, and Related Projects

- 0. Strategic plan is now on the IECMH Website.
- 1. Infographics available, including one-page references and resources designed to be easy to share and flexible to meet different needs.
- 2. Five goals included in the Strategic Plan:
  - o Goal 1: Clear and consistent shared understanding of IECMH
  - Goal 2: Diverse, highly skilled, interdisciplinary, and well-supported workforce
  - o Goal 3: Sustainable, diverse public and private funding options
  - o Goal 4: Intentional collaboration and coordination
  - o Goal 5: Data systems and policy development
    - i. Zero to Three, Financing Policy Project (ZTT FPP) Update:
      - 1. The team Zero to Three Financing Policy Project (ZTT FPP), highlighted key insights from a recent in-person convening held March 17–19, 2025, in Minneapolis.
      - CCBHC Planning Grant: Colorado received a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) planning grant. This is a pivotal time to engage in the needs assessment process to ensure IECMH is prioritized. The specific entity conducting the assessment is currently unknown; Shannon is following up.
      - 3. Safe Babies Approach: A breakout session focused on the Safe Babies model, which integrates mental health principles into dependency and neglect proceedings. States are exploring enhanced reimbursement rates for child welfare-involved cases, as well as opportunities to use opioid settlement funds to expand Safe Babies programming.

#### **Legislative Updates**

1. Erica Gannett, BHA



- a. **State Budget:** Colorado faces a \$1.2B deficit. The BHA worked to protect core services and shift away from smaller, admin-heavy programs by promoting more flexible, efficient approaches.
- b. Agenda Bill: The BHA's sole bill is a <u>technical cleanup of universal</u>
   <u>behavioral health contracting</u>, reducing 16 original requirements down to 4 core provisions.

- 2. Shannon Schell, CDEC
  - a. **Budget Focus:** CDEC prioritized navigating a tough budget year, using existing cash and federal funds to offset general fund reductions.
  - b. **Key Investments:** Despite cuts, the state made investments in early intervention, CCAP, and the universal preschool program.
  - c. **No Department Bills:** CDEC introduced no legislative items, focusing instead on protecting existing programs and preparing for potential policy proposals.

- 3. Christina Walker, Healthier Colorado
  - a. Christina shared this presentation.
  - b. <u>HB25-1002</u>: Fair Standards in Mental Health Care: Signed into law last week. Aligns insurance practices with generally accepted medical standards by defining "medical necessity" in statute. Aims to reduce denial of mental health services across all ages, including infants and young children.
  - c. <u>\$B25-017:</u> Codifies and strengthens Child Care Health Consultants (CCHCs) and Healthy Steps Programs.
  - d. **Advocacy & Testimony Guidance:** Provided a testimony outline and tips: be clear, brief (2–3 minutes), and state if you're a constituent or council member. Shared advocacy tools, including <u>5calls.org</u>.

- 4. Melissa Buchholz, ABCD
  - a. Suggested the Council focus not only on "big P" policy (legislation, budget) but also "little p" policy—the planning, implementation, and coordination work that happens between legislative sessions.



- b. The strategic plan is a key tool for guiding this ongoing, behind-the-scenes work.
- c. Encouraged the Council to think ahead about which policies to pursue and how to implement them effectively.

# Community Spotlight: Council Member Evelin Gomez, The Kempe Center for the Prevention and Treatment of Child Abuse and Neglect

#### <u>Trauma-Responsive Implementation and Practice (TRIP) Program</u>

- 1. Evelin shared this presentation.
- 2. Key Initiatives:
  - Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT): Partnering with CISU on data infrastructure. Findings from 42 provider interviews show a need for better integration of trauma-informed care (TIC) and DEI principles into PCIT practice.
  - Trauma-Responsive Practice in Schools: Early outcomes at Range
     View and Sky View schools show: Increased trauma-responsiveness,
     greater leadership support, and growth in cultural competence and
     staff confidence in supporting students' social-emotional needs.
  - Preschool Engagement: 5 preschools participating; early results show:
     100% of teachers increased trauma-responsive practices and 75%
     improved in using developmentally appropriate trauma responses.
  - Statewide Expansion & Strategy: Preparing to expand to Weld District 8
     (2025–2026). TRIP work aligns with HB24-1406, a strategic initiative of the CO BHA. Current focus includes mapping existing supports, collaborating with CDE, and holding listening sessions (April–May) to inform future implementation.
