#	Step	What Happens
1	Open with the Lord's Prayer	Recited together as a whole school/class to begin.
2	Pledges	Pledge of Allegiance and any school/Bible pledges.
3	Scripture of the Week	Read and recite this week's verse (see chart).
4	Memory Song for the Quarter	Sing the quarter's song (see Quarterly Expectations).
5	Bible Deep Dive	Activity, Bible study, scripture breakdown, discussion, research, trivia, journaling — teacher's choice.
