



Figure 1. This is a figure, Schemes follow the same formatting. If there are multiple panels, they should be listed as: (a) Description of what is contained in the first panel; (b) Description of what is

2. Discussion: The discussion is highlighted through the title and subtitles of the section when needed

We recommend preparing the references with a bibliography software package like **Mendeley** to avoid typing mistakes and duplicated references. Reference sources must provide **80%** of journal articles, proceedings, or research results from **the last five years indexed by Scopus**, with a **minimum of 30 articles**.
