4.) Gas Kiln Update – Cathi Jefferson: Progressing. Metal Partial Wall, Metal Siding, insulation, rack wall. Ribs in on Sunday. Jeannie and David donating wood for framing. Goal to be done by May. Email Cathi to be put on the list to help. Gas fitter still needs to do a fire test, but the work needs to be complete before that could take place.

How is the community kiln going to work? Sign up and pay online to buy space in the kiln for a firing. Cone 10 is needed. When you buy space in the kiln – the glazes are provided, plus you are buying space and fuel for firing.

The kiln is attached to the Clay Hub – but we can add a link to the guild website. Average # of pieces – a milk carton space – measured cubic inches.

5.)Education: MISSA Metchosin International Summer School of the Arts

Will be back at Pearson International College in Metchosin on July 18th to 31st – roughly 35 classes will run for the two weeks 2 day classes on the 2 weekend and 5 day classes on the week days – there are two classes which run 7 days. Accommodations and meals are available. It is a fabulous experience where you can meet like minded people.

7.) Atmospheric Firing Show – Linda Helms. Last year was the second show, but the first as a guild show. Takes place November 16th to December 11th 4 weeks. 10 potters have committed to next years show – able to have 16 people. Kat is willing to do a spring and fall sawdust/smoke firing.

\$1800.00 for space rental for the four weeks – based on 12 it is 150.00 per person. Think Gallery for your pieces 8" medium to large pieces, make sets of smaller pieces, have lots of wall space to use. There may be costs beyond the \$150 for advertising and food. Mug wall at this years show – must donate 2 small pieces for the wall to be sold as a fundraiser for the guild, anyone can donate to the wall – do not need to be in the show to donate and any type of firing is welcome. 20% to gallery and 80% to guild.
