Unit 5: I Can Be a Worker

Stage 1: Desired Results		
•	In this unit, students will learn about choice and about occupations. Students will explore money, trade, and various helper jobs. Concepts of money, trade, and barter should be practiced by students.	 What are some different helper jobs? What choices do people make? How do choices made by me and other people affect our lives? What is trade? barter? What is money?

•	Understand what <i>trade</i> is. Understand what <i>money</i> is used for. Identify <i>barter</i> as a form of trade. Understand that economic systems are created to address scarcity of resources.	 Identify various jobs and careers within the community. Explain why people can't have everything they want. Determine if people make choices based on limited resources. Explain that people benefit when they trade voluntarily. Describe times when they have traded, the goods or services exchanged, and the benefit they got from the trade. Identify the personal characteristics needed for certain jobs and careers. Discuss how we can make good choices. Identify the difference between a good and a service.

Essential Questions: How do people choose their jobs and careers? Students will analyze choices made regarding career paths by:

identifying jobs and careers in their community.

identifying the personal characteristics and interests that are needed for certain jobs and careers.
