We provide learning opportunities for BSW, MSW and Advanced Standing students. Interns can have direct practice assignments as well as macro/ mezzo assignments depending on their interest.

Possible assignments include:

Direct Practice

- Provide trauma informed, person centered case management to a small caseload of families
- Conduct dyadic (baby and parent) sessions utilizing an evidence based curriculum focusing on attachment and enhancing parenting skills and knowledge of early childhood development
- Provide supportive counseling to parents
- Co-facilitate curriculum based parent groups
- Collaborate in developing/ planning additional programming for families
- Assist with Food Pantry Distribution
- Other programmatic task as assigned

Macro and Mezzo Practice

- Develop and facilitate workshops on a variety of topics for our families
- Assist in conducting focus groups
- Assist with developing pre and post surveys
- Conduct literature review for grant writing
- Other programmatic task as assigned

Supervision

- Individual weekly clinical supervision
- Weekly Task supervision
- Weekly social work team meetings
- Various trainings throughout the academic year

Requirements:

- Must be currently enrolled in a BSW or MSW program
- Spanish Fluency required as all services are provided in spanish
- Commitment to working with the immigrant community.
- Tuesdays are a required day
