It is a nonprofit organization that has been around for 19 years. With the help of Jim Summey and Greta Bush, HPCAV has successfully been able to work with the High Point Police Department to eliminate the violent crimes that affect the people of High Point, NC. 50% of the people that work with HPCAV do not reoffend and only 1 in 10 do. Topic 1 :45 High Point Community Against Violence is a non-profit organization that works with the Violent Crimes Task Force, which is a group of law enforcement officials that consist of the High Point Police Department, North Carolina Community Corrections, ATF, FBI, SBI, DEA, District Attorney's office and the U.S. Attorney's office in order to continue protecting our citizens from violent crimes. Our goal and mission is simple: keep the citizens of High Point safe. Since it's inception in 1997, they have partnered with the High Point Police Department and the implementation of the Focused Deterrence Program, the overall crime rate of the community has decreased by *insert statistic here* Transition :10 With all of these great improvements and government groups working together, HPCAV would not be as successful without the help

It is pivotal for the organization to have volunteers because they are the individuals who help conduct the Call-In meetings. Call-in's occur once every three months. They are open to the public and the community presence adds to the larger message of ending violent crime. The Call-In's are where the the violent criminals attend the meeting with their parole officer. Jim Summey and Greta Bush explain to the violent criminals how they want to help stay out of jail and live a life of freedom. The Police Department, FBI, DEA, etc. are there to let them know if they do not agree to work with HPCAV then their options are either a life of prison or death. The HPCAV team, including volunteers, go door to door handing out information to the surrounding area's about ITS what type of crime just occurred, who was involved and what the community can do to help. 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Jim Summey officially agreed to run HPCAV in 2009 as their first ever Executive Director. Jim used to serve as a Christian minister for 36 years which coincidentally prepared him for his current position. HPCAV was united in 1997 when the Task Force joined with the Police Department to eliminate violent crime in the community. Jim has been with the organization since the beginning and has continued to decrease the violent crime within the community. A quote from Jim Summey includes, "It's been a pleasure seeing the work we have put in over the past 19 years positively manifest itself in the High Point community."
